We Walk By Faith, Not By Sight in Partnership with God

"The Lord be with you".

Dear People of God, today Holy Mother the Church celebrates the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B. The Liturgical readings invite us to reflect and meditate on how small things become great thanks to the power of God. The reign of God, overlooked by most people as an insignificant seed, is however cherished by those who know its full potential. The Reign or Kingdom of God is presented to us as a mustard seed, though smallest of all seeds, springs up and becomes the largest of plants, like the tender shoot from the cedar which will bear fruit and become a majestic cedar. Thus, shall the just and faithful who have been planted: they flourish, grow, bear fruit and are vigorous and sturdy, like a cedar.

Beloved, two common phrases we are used to hearing these days are "the bigger, the better!" and "the more, the merrier!" Many corporations want to be the largest in their industry. People want to live big, live in the biggest house, drive the biggest car and belong to the biggest Church. Churches and prayer centres want to be the biggest of their time and be able to organize the biggest events of a life time. Today's Gospel reading presents a contrast to that in two brief but all important parables: the parables of the scattered seed and that of the mustard seed. They both compare the reign of God to seeds. In the first one, the seed grows slowly day by day. The second, about the mustard seed, is very small but grows large enough to give shelter and shade. Both of these parables are about big results emerging from small beginnings. A few bags of grain can produce a harvest large enough to fill a silo. A tiny mustard seed can become a home for the birds of the air.

These Agricultural images are beyond simple farming. They serve as a caution by asking us to avoid identifying "size" with "significance". Experience has shown that bigger is not necessarily better; nor more necessarily merrier. We often find quality products in smaller business. Similarly, a majority does not necessarily decide what is right. More often than not, minorities have been the great "change agents" and carriers of truth for the rest of society. Renewal and revival have come through minorities. Confusing size with significance has led us to believe that the Church with the most members is effective. Size can often make a community or society complacent, fat and lethargic. Numbers sometimes create confusion rather than a blessing. It is not the number of people who claim the name "Christian" that will change our world but the intensity with which they live their faith. The faith that makes a difference is not the one that grows outward but the one that grows within.

When we look at the beautiful world around us, we should call to mind the magnificent truth that the growth we see began with small seeds that grew slowly over the years. The same is true in our Church life and our spiritual life. God's loving care has established us in the Church through Baptism and nourishes and watches over us through the sacramental economy of salvation. Our spiritual vitality begins with a trickle of water at Baptism. It grows with a wafer of bread in Holy Communion and a smudge of consecrated oil at Confirmation. Slowly the graces planted in us through those sacraments can grow into a heroic and life-changing holiness that profoundly affects others. The life of the Church cannot be left out. The seeds of the Kingdom are always being sown. When a parent teaches a child to make the Sign of the Cross; when religious education teachers, Sunday school teachers, and catechist struggle to hand on the truths of faith through their activities, teaching and catechesis; when marriage counsellors prepare couples for holy matrimony with the truths of God and the Church; when we meet as a group or society to have Bible Studies and pray; when a Catholic visits the sick, help the homeless, and counsels the doubtful; when we celebrate Mass and pray for the living and the dead; we are sowing seeds of the Kingdom. Which of them will grow and at what rate is not for us to determine. The growth will happen in God's appointed time. Ours is to sow the seeds and God will give the growth.

God's reign unfolds in our moral conduct when in our homes and workplaces we are patient or forgiving towards those we live and work with. It is recognized in the helping hand extended to anyone in need, or in the gentle and healing touch of the health caretaker. The reward we will receive from the Lord, as St Paul reminds us in today's second reading, is not for the growth but for the number of seeds we tried and managed to sow. We all want to look forward to a great future for our nation and for our Church. If and when that will happen is not in our control. We should focus on the faithful seeding, the generous planting, and leave the rest to God. Never count your small and humble beginnings as little and insignificant. Everything great we see around us started little, thanks to the power of God. Imbedded in little and humble beginnings is the potential for greatness. Our beginnings may be compared to a mustard seed, very small but has all the potentials in itself. It is most time overlooked by many, seen as an insignificant seed, but for those privileged to know its potential they love and cherish it. Love and cherish your humble beginnings.

As a plant grows unnoticed by many, if not all, so does the development of God's reign escape our awareness. However, there is difference between plant growth and the growth of God's reign. A long time is usually required to see the progress of a plant. But time alone will not reveal the action of God in the world today: we need the eyes of faith. With the eyes of faith we recognize the reign of God being realized in our midst everywhere and at all times. As we walk by faith and not by sight, may our lives bear fruit in abundance!

Please, remember to stay well, healthy and safe. Be not afraid to attend Mass. Wear your nose mask and observe all the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us. God bless and keep you safe.
