Your Little is Enough in The Hands of God

"The Lord be with you".

Dear People of God, we celebrate the Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B. The liturgical readings present us with the reality of hunger, miraculous feedings and the efficacy of the Word of the Lord. The miracle performed by the prophet Elisha finds its perfect fulfilment in Jesus' feeding of the five thousand. He is the one who opens His hands and satisfies our deepest needs. In Him we form one body.

Today's Gospel reading recounts the magnificently generous miracle of the feeding of a crowd. In this episode, the crowd was large, across the Sea of Galilee, far away from town. In human calculation, it's impossible to provide food to satisfy their hunger. What is impossible for man is possible for God because He is the Lord of compassion and love. Jesus challenges the disciples to come up with a solution: "Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?" Andrew's half-hearted initiative and the boy's generosity were blessed by God in the form of a huge miracle. The small boy's five barley loaves and two fish were enough to feed five thousand men besides several women and children to satisfaction. God works when we are willing to cooperate with Him. Complaining and murmuring about the enormity of a problem will not solve it until we are willing and generous to take our own initiative and place the little we have at the feet of the Lord.

In the second reading, St Paul exhorts us to "lead a life worthy of the calling to which you were called, with all humility and gentleness, and with patience, support one another in love, always eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit". Humility, gentleness and patience in all situations and loving support to each other – that is the essence of Christian life. That is what Andrew and the little boy sort to do in the Gospel reading, handing to Jesus what they had.

On the whole, we are reminded to appreciate ourselves and what we have, and make the effort to support each other. Nothing is little in the hands of God. The Christian is the Eucharistic Bread whom Christ offers to satisfy the hunger and thirst, to heal the pain and brokenness of others. The little you offer is a miraculous relief and divine intervention in the life of another. Do not be like Philip, immobilized by the size of the work to be done, but like Andrew and the boy, let us hand over our little. We should be assured that whatever we do for the Lord and others is gathered by God to be used now or later. Nothing is indeed impossible for God with our little.

We celebrate and appreciate all Grandparents for your lives and contributions to humanity and God's people. May God richly bless and keep you safe, healthy and for many years on this your special day.

Please, remember to stay well, healthy and safe. Be not afraid to attend Mass. Wear your nose mask and observe all the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us.
