May God Be Gracious and Bless Us This Year

Dear People of God, today is a special day for all of us; today *fiat* ('yes') was a response of faith. New Year promises new is the first day of the first month of this brand new year. To- and fresh beginnings. We enter this new year imitating Mary's day is 1st January 2023. Today, Christians celebrate several festive events. We celebrate, first of all, New Year's Day; then we think of the circumcision of Jesus which took place eight days after His birth; the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God; and finally, in 1968 Pope Paul VI chose January 1 as the "World Day of Peace". On this Octave Day of the Nativity of the Lord and the First Day of the Year 2023, we seek God's blessings at this Eucharistic Celebration. Because of Mary's Son, we have gained and attained sonship of God and so we can confidently call God, "Abba", Father.

On Friday, 30th December, we celebrated the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, a model for all who fear the Lord and walk in His ways. It gave us an opportunity to reflect on the state of our families. We reflected on the importance of family life rooted in the unconditional love of God as witnessed by the Holy Family: lessons of silence, a communion of love, austere and simple beauty, sacred and inviolable character, and of the virtue of hardwork and sacrifice. Our attention was drawn to each member's specific role in the plan of God and how we must endeavour to work out our roles perfectly. The Holy Family is exemplary in virtues of love, obedience, harmony, cooperation and understanding. We saw that families must be united and supportive of each other in times of joy and happiness, likewise in danger, pain, and suffering. We were reminded that honouring father and mother, obeying, helping, and being kind toward them guarantee a life of gladness and reward from God. Though the virtues of compassion, care, kindness, lowliness, meekness, patience and forgiveness should adorn the life of every member of a family, love must rate above all these virtues.

In fact, God should and must be the focal point of our families such that whatever we do in word or deed, will be done in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him. No matter how we started or our families started, what matters is our renewed commitment to being family people. Striving to fulfil our God-given roles as members of the family should be our daily motivation and goal. We prayed and continue to pray for all earthly families, those facing challenges, difficulties and struggles, that all may imitate the Holy Family in practising the virtues of family life and in the bonds of charity. The family, even one with problems, is our Nazareth where through all the dynamics of family life, good and bad, people can still grow in wisdom, grace and in the fear of the Lord.

On this New Year's Day, Mother Church invites us to celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, through whom the world would be blessed. It gives us the opportunity to also bless God for Mary, who bore for us the Child she named Jesus, the Saviour. Called in the Gospels "the mother of Jesus", Mary is acclaimed by Elizabeth, at the prompting of the Holy Spirit and even before the birth of her Son, as "the mother of my Lord". In fact, the One whom she conceived as man by the Holy Spirit, who truly became her Son according to the flesh, was none other than the Father's eternal Son, the second Person of the Holy Trinity. Hence, the Church confesses that Happy and Blessed Year 2023. Mary is truly the "Mother of God" (Theotokos). Mary does not understand everything that happens but she welcomes and ponders in her heart what God is doing in and with her. Her Our Lady of the Holy Rosary, Pray for Us.

"ves" to God, her attentiveness and receptivity to God's Word with a refreshed vision of faith, and a renewed commitment to Christ and His Church.

The first reading from the Book of Numbers is a priestly blessing in which the "name" of God is invoked on the people. The priest prayed these blessings on the people of God: "The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord let His face shine upon you; the Lord uncover His face to you and bring you peace". To let the Lord's face shine upon us is to see the presence of God in all the events of our lives and to see, woven in these events, the Lord's strengthening, correcting, helping, healing, teaching, and redeeming graces. There is a presence of the Lord in everything that happens to us. St Paul in the second reading sums up the purpose of the Incarnation, God made man. That is, God sent forth His Son to save us and then sent forth His Spirit into our hearts so that we can be heirs of Christ's mission, not to be slaves, but sons and daughters of God. In our Gospel, the shepherds found the infant with Mary and Joseph. A classic feature of our Catholic life is to make Mary and Joseph companions in our spiritual life. They will lead us to a deeper union with Jesus Christ. Mary is the quiet light, the morning star to guide us. What better way to begin the new year than to ask for her help so that we would have the stamina, faith, and courage she showed in listening to the Lord's command.

Many are the resolution we have made for the new year regarding our life, family, work, friends, career, faith, and many other aspects of life. One good resolution for this year is to use our time in prayer to discern God's face, God's presence, and God's Word to us in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health, to know that everything has its place in God's redeeming plan. Another good resolution for the new year is to define ourselves not by what we are against but by what we are for; not just to oppose but to promote; not to lament what we find in our world but to focus on what we will bring to our world; not to curse the darkness but to light a candle. We can be the positive change we want to see around us such that where we do not find honesty, truth, respect, loyalty, and fidelity, we can put them there. We need to rekindle the light of our faith and be the light of the world so that the face of the earth may be renewed.

Beloved, at the beginning of the New Year, may the Lord bless and keep you; may He let His face shine upon you and be gracious to you; and may He uncover his face to you and bring you peace.
