## **Our Vocation as God's Delight Servants**

day in Ordinary Time, Year (A). Jesus is presented to us as the Lamb of God and the Light of the nations who came to do the Father's Will. In Christ, we have been called to be a holy people.

The Liturgical time that is referred to as the Ordinary Time or Sundays in the Year begins with the Baptism of the Lord that we celebrated last Monday. Besides the times of the year that have their own distinctive character, there remains in the Yearly Cycle of Thirty-Three or Thirty-Four weeks in which no particular aspect of the Mystery of Christ is celebrated, but rather the Mystery of Christ itself is honoured in its fullness, especially on Sundays. This period is known as Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time began on Tuesday, 10<sup>th</sup> January, and continues through Tuesday, 21st February, the day before Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Lenten Season. It will resume when Easter Season ends, that is, on Monday, 29<sup>th</sup> May, the day following Pentecost.

We cannot speak of Ordinary Time without speaking of Sunday. The every Seven-Day celebration of the Lord's Day is the basic structure upon which the Church Year is built. The great liturgical seasons of Advent-Christmas and Lent-Easter are more expansive celebrations of particular aspects of the one mystery, a mystery so overwhelming that we are compelled to separate out its various elements for particular attention. These seasons in no way minimize the critical importance of the Sunday Celebration throughout the rest of the year. Ordinary Time is not very ordinary at all. Ordinary Time, the Celebration of Sunday, is the identifying mark of the Christina community which comes together, remembering that on this first day of the week, the Lord of Life was raised up and creation came at last to completion. Sunday, as a day of rest, prayer and worship, is a Sacrament of redeemed time. How we live Sunday proclaims to the world what we believe about redeemed time now and forever. What happens in our Church every Sunday is the fruit of our week. What happens as the fruit of the week past is the beginning of the week to come. Sunday, like all Sacraments, is simultaneously a point of arrival and departure for us Christians on our way to the fullness of the Kingdom. This is not ordinary at all, but the fabric of our Christian living.

On the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, we celebrate the Servant of God who came to do the Father's Will in perfect obedience. Yet He was more than a servant. St John the Baptist, who has just baptised Jesus, proclaims to the people who Jesus really is. He uses two biblical images, that of the Lamb and that of the Servant who suffers innocently for his people. The Passover Lamb that was sacrificed opened the way for liberation. Jesus will be this instrument of liberation and like the Servant, He will suffer innocently. He is indeed the lamb, the chosen One of God. Following Our Lord's Baptism at the hands of John the Baptist, His mission is immediately spelt out in clear terms in today's readings. The first reading, from the prophet Isaiah, speaks of the image of the Servant of the Lord, who

Dear People of God, today we celebrate the Second Sun- will be a light to the nations and who will take God's salvation to the ends of the earth. This mysterious servant will bring healing to others through his suffering and pains. This suffering servant says God formed him and called him to bring the people of Israel back to their God. He would be faithful to that call. Then the Lord continues that it is not enough for him to bring back the people of Israel. He would be a light to the whole world. The servant thought his mission was local. Encrypted within it was a purpose for his life that was much larger. That is the call within the call. Jesus, the fulfilment of this prophecy, is pointed out as the Lamb who takes away the sins not only of Israel but of the whole world. The Spirit descended upon Jesus at His Baptism and John realized He is the Lamb of God. John realized later that is why he was sent, not only to preach repentance but to identify the Messiah.

> We too have been called to the service of God and His Church in obedience by virtue of our Baptism. God's Spirit is in our hearts to make us more perfectly bound to the Church and effective witnesses to Christ. The Spirit solidifies and consolidates the gifts given at Baptism. Like St Paul, sanctified in Christ Jesus, we are called to be saints in union with millions of people in every place who call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. We are called by God's will to be His delight and obedient servants and apostles (chosen and sent), filled with the Holy Spirit, to be light to the nations so that God's salvation will reach the ends of the earth. In living our public vocation as spouses, parents, grandparents, educators, priests, religious, businesspersons, craftsmen, civil or public servants, children and students, we are those chosen and sent as light to people to bring God's salvation to them. This is our deeper vocation and purpose here on earth.
