Accompanying Our Saviour, Love and Faithful to the End

Dear People of God, today, the Sixth Sunday of Lent (Year Catechumen and of the Sick are blessed while the Oil of A), we celebrate the Passion/Palm Sunday to mark the start Chrism is consecrated in the liturgy for the sacramental life of Holy Week. Palm Sunday brings us to the last phase of our Lenten journey that we began on Ash Wednesday. The Church's Holy Week begins by recalling the joyful and triumphant entry of Christ into Jerusalem and the immediate sorrow of the Passion narrative. Christ the Lord entered Jerusalem to accomplish his Paschal Mystery (suffering, crucifixion, death and resurrection) for the salvation of humanity. He is not taken unawares by the Passion. Humbling Himself out of love for us, He did not shield His face from buffets and spitting but offered His life in obedience on the Cross. He relied on his Father's love, persevered and was faithful to the end.

Acclaimed as Son of David, as the One who brings salvation (Hosanna means "save!" or "give salvation!"), the King of Glory enters His City riding on an ass/donkey to identify with the poor and weak. In telling of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, St Matthew makes us feel a deeper meaning in the traditional forms of welcome of pilgrims for great festivals greeted by strewing palm branches in their paths: Jesus is indeed the heir to David's throne, the fulfilment of prophetic hope. The palms we hold in our hands symbolize Christ's royalty and reign of peace. He conquers the Daughter of Zion, a figure of His Church, neither by ruse nor violence, but by humility, modesty and simplicity that bears witness to the truth. The subjects of His Kingdom are those who acclaim Him "the prophet Jesus, from Nazareth of Galilee". Their acclamation, "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord", is taken up by the Church in the "Sanctus" of the Eucharistic Liturgy of the Lord's Passover. Christ, the Suffering Servant, though Divine, was humble to the point of death so we can have life in abundance. Aware of His mission, He is faithful to the end at the cost of His life to fulfil God's plan and usher in a new time of grace.

The Holy Week, full of solemn celebrations, is ordered to commemorate Christ's Passion, beginning with his Messianic entrance into Jerusalem. The days of the Holy Week, from Monday to Thursday inclusive, have precedence over all other celebrations of the Church. Principal within the Holy Week is the Sacred Paschal Triduum: beginning on Holy Thursday in which we commemorate the day Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist and Priesthood; Good (Holy) Friday in which we commemorate the day Jesus was executed on the Cross; and Holy Saturday in which we commemorate in the Vigil Mass Christ's emergence from the Tomb. The liturgies of these days are dramatic, "re-enactments" of events which happened during Jesus' last days and culminated in his victory over death. As these days unfold, the liturgical assembly is thought to be engaged in acts of historical "reconstruction" that recreate scenes in the "Upper Room", on Calvary, and at the Tomb. Christians are encouraged to imagine themselves as actually present at these events - comforting Jesus during His fearful watch in Gethsemane, walking with Him along the Via Crucis (Stations of the Cross), and witnessing His miraculous "Return to Life" on Easter Morning.

Holy Thursday morning is the Mass of Chrism. It is concelebrated by the Bishop with his Clergy, a sign of the unity and communion of the priests with their Bishop. Though it usually takes place on Thursday morning, for pastoral reasons it can be celebrated on an earlier day. Besides the renewing of Ordination Vows/Promises, Oils of

of the Church. The lay faithful are encouraged to be present and to accompany their priests with prayers. The Lit-urgy on Holy Thursday evening, the Mass of the Lord's Supper, reminds us that, before the Feast of Passover, Jesus celebrated the Last Supper with His disciples. In it, He gave us His precious Body and Blood and the means to have and receive Him in the Institution of the Holy Priesthood. In this same liturgy we are invited to imitate Christ in his humility and service to humanity typified in the Washing of the Feet of His disciples and to adore the Blessed Sacrament.

Good Friday, Friday of the Passion of the Lord, the liturgy tells us that, entrusting His life to the Father, Jesus bore our infirmities, and obedient unto death, He won for us eternal salvation. As we honour the suffering/passion and death of the Lord Jesus so too do we prepare ourselves to share more deeply in His Resurrection. The Via Crucis, Proclamation of the Lord's Passion, Solemn Intercessions, and the Adoration/Veneration of the Holy Cross take the centre stage of the liturgy. On Holy Saturday, the Easter Vigil in the Holy Night, Mother of all Vigils, the Church gathers around the Tomb with the liturgy of the Lucernarium (Service of the Light), Liturgies of the Word and the Renewal of Baptismal Promises to await the Risen Christ. The celebration calls to mind that the stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone and that if we have journeyed and died with Christ, we shall also rise with Him and pass from death to life.

Truly, these faith-anchoring events are historical, and be-cause they are historical, they cannot be repeated or reenacted. Thus, the Church's long tradition insists that what happened once in history passes over into the mystery of the assembly's liturgical or sacramental celebrations. What the Paschal Triduum actually celebrates is a mystery, not history; anamnesis, not mimesis. They celebrate not what happened to Jesus but what is now happening among us called to conversion, gathered in faith, and gifted with the Spirit of holiness. They celebrate God's taking possession of our hearts at their deepest core, recreating us as a new human community broken like bread for the world's life a community rich in compassion, steadfast in hope, and fearless in the search for social justice and peace. In participating actively, fully, and consciously in these celebra-tions of the Holy Week we share in the graces and fruits therein to love and be faithful to the end.

Dear Students, the Holy Week invites us to accompany our Saviour Jesus Christ in faith and love. As we participate actively, fully, and consciously in the Mysteries of our Salvation we enjoy the grace to remain faithful to the end. We are reminded not only of sin but assured of Easter. Do not miss this opportunity! God bless, protect, and keep us safe for the rest of the Semester. Pax!

Please be reminded to stay well, healthy, and safe. Be not afraid to attend Mass. Remember to observe all the safety protocols. Get vaccinated if you are not. Your life is dear to us.
