We Have Seen The Lord

Acts 4:32-37 / Ps. 93:1-2, 5 / Jn. WEDNESDAY - 19/04/23 6:30AM Acts 5:17-26 / Ps. 34:2-9 / Jn. 3:16 Prayers and the breaking of the Word and Bread.

> The Second Sunday of Easter is traditionally celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday. On this day, Holy Mother Church all over the world concludes the Novena to the Divine Mercy, asking move from unbelief to belief which made him confess Jesus: the God of Eternal and Undying Mercy to lavish upon us and will not find peace until it turns with trust to the Divine Mercy. Justification. A practical way of showing this mercy is in the forgiveness of sins. Jesus died and rose so that He might take away our sins. He forgives us and empowers us to forgive others by giving us His Spirit. Truly, the peace with which He greeted His disciples in today's Gospel will reign in our hearts, minds, lives, homes, activities, and our society if we realize that: we ought to forgive as Christ forgives us.

Our first reading recalls the lifestyle of the first Christian community. All who believed in Christ Jesus were together and had all things in common. These believers were devoted to the teachings of the Apostles and to communal life: prayers and breaking of bread. Because of that, awe came upon everyone, and many wonders and signs were also wrought among them. Togetherness (family), Teachings of the Apostles (Scriptures), Prayers (Union with God), and the Eucharist (Communion of the Faithful) were the spirituality (way of life) of the early believers. This is a Spirituality that all of us are encouraged to live, if not already living it. Because of the faith in the Risen Lord, the unity of the believers made it possible for them to practice charity, to care for the weak among them, and to share gladly and with a generous heart their goods and possessions. How precious are the teachings of the Apostles captured in the Scriptures, the teachings of the Church in the various Magisterial Documents, Family Devotions, and Personal Prayers to us?

St John begins his Gospel with emphasis on the first day of the week (the Christian Sabbath, Sunday), the doors being shut where the disciples had gathered, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst, saying to them "Peace be with you". The Evangelist specifically notes that the doors were locked to make the point that Jesus now has a different kind of existence. He leads people slowly and gently to recognize His new presence. His earthly life was over. He possesses a Risen Body that is imperishable, powerful, glorious, and spiritual as opposed to a perishable, weak, dishonourable, and natural earth- Have a Fruitful and Blessed Week! ly body. Jesus came, stood in the midst of the disciples who had locked themselves up out of fear, and said to them: "Peace be with you". Having wished them peace three times, and assured them of His presence, He added "as the Father has sent me, so I

When they recognized Him, a transformation hapday of Easter, Year (A), we gather in the Spirit and Victory of pens in their lives and they become His missionaries. Very interesting is the fact that Christ helps skeptical Thomas to "My Lord and My God". Thomas believed because he saw the the whole world His Divine Mercy. It is in response to the Risen Jesus. The testimony of his companions the Apostles was words of Jesus Christ to St Faustina, in a vision, that humanity not enough for him. He insisted on a personal experience with the Risen Lord which turned out to be an insistence on love At the centre of Easter's message are Mercy, Forgiveness, and rather than unbelief on the part of Thomas. He was unwilling to accept that Jesus could deprive him of that much-awaited experience. He loved a suffering Christ and insisted to have a close experience of the holes made by the nails that pierced the hands and the wound that was created on His side by the lance. Although we have never seen Him (physically), we believe in Him. As Christ's followers, we need to avail ourselves as He leads us daily to true belief. The disciples of Christ do not only have to keep the faith but must also profess it, confidently bear witness to it, and spread it. We meet the Risen Lord in the Sunday gathering of the faithful. The community of believers through its life of cheerfulness, simplicity, and brotherliness, is evidence that Christ is alive and with us. We nature the gift of faith by gathering as one family for prayers, for the breaking of the Word and Bread, and in our communal sharing of what we
