Corpus Christi, The Food and Drink of Eternal Life

Dear People of God, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy The Gospel from John presents us with the climax of the "bread of Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) Sunday, Year (A). Just life" discourse and announces a bold promise of eternal life. The (food and drink) from heaven, so too do we feed on the best of wheat, the Bread of Angels, food for the pilgrim journey. The food His Son, given for the life of the world. The Eucharist is Jesus' gift to His Church.

Jesus, the Bread come down from heaven, has to be crunched by the believer who desires eternal life. Entering into communion with Jesus is the way that gives life now and afterwards. The Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ allows the believer to live this experience anew every time. Reverence for the Lord's presence in the Eucharist dates from the earliest generations of Christians, as is clear from the "Bread of Life" discourse in St John and the meal narratives with Eucharistic overtones found in all the Gospels. But it was not until the tenth and eleventh centuries that devotion to the Blessed Sacrament as an object of prayerful adoration developed extensively among the Christian faithful. The read-God's loving providence is always with us. For forty years He ings illuminate some aspects of today's solemnity, inviting us to reflect on the mystery of our faith in the real presence, the Eucharist as the source of our unity, and as nourishment for the soul.

The first reading recalls the way in which God fed the people of Israel in the desert with manna, that miraculous food that Christians later saw as a prefiguration of the Eucharist. God fed Israel with manna for a purpose, that is, to teach Israel that God's Word is the source of life on which they must depend. As Israel relied on manna for nourishment and life in the desert, so the people must continually depend on the Word of God. Humbled by their lack of basic needs such as food and water, they are to live by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God. God's people must remember and praise Him for His marvellous deeds for them: for bringing them out of the land of Egypt, their house of bondage; for leading them through the great and terrible wilderness, with its fiery serpents and scorpions and thirsty ground where there was no water; and giving them water from the flinty rock and feeding them with the manna. They are to remember God's providence Dear Students, Jesus offers Himself to us as the Bread of Life. In toward them all the time.

The cup of blessing to which St Paul refers in the second reading was a common feature of Jewish meals. After a meal, a prayer of thanksgiving was offered over this "blessing cup" of wine. Paul is speaking of the Christian Eucharist, however, when he asserts that this cup of blessing "which we bless" is a sharing (communion, participation) in the Blood of Christ. One may easily see in this a reference to the believer's participation in Christ's saving and atoning death, for a cup of blood was commonly part of a sacrifice. Nevertheless, the emphasis is more appropriately placed on the communal dimension of the cup and bread. Paul emphasizes the communal identity entailed in our participation in the Eucharist. For him, the Church is the Body of Christ, and our sacramental participation makes us into Christ's Body. When we receive Holy Communion, we all receive the same Jesus, drawing us together. God bless and keep you safe. is made one with the Lord Himself, who is fully identified with the sacred species. The latter interpretation is the one most ideal for a feast concerning the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. It does not, however, rule out the relevance of faith in the teachings of Jesus for obtaining eternal life, for when believers "take in" the flesh and blood of Christ, they must surely embrace His teachings as well. Jesus is indeed the bread of life which surpasses even the gift of manna. In Jesus God gives us bread that is life-giving for

now and forever.

took care of His people in the desert despite their stubborn, sinful ways. Jesus gives Himself to us as the Bread of Life, stating clearly that we must eat His flesh and drink His blood for us to have life in Him. How deeply do we believe in the Catholic faith in the Eucharist? How often do we go for Holy Communion with no spiritual preparation or reverence in our physical posture? It is the real and whole Jesus who offers us eternal life that we receive, our redeemer and healer. There is the need therefore to re-examine our journey with Jesus in the Eucharist, asking for the grace to draw closer to Him. Some for one reason or another cannot receive communion. This does not mean that they are cut off completely from a life of union with Jesus and have no possibility of being nourished by Him. All believers must go to Jesus. When we participate fully in the Eucharistic celebration, so much the better. When this is not possible, other means of nourishment available is to listen attentively to the Word of God, and to commit one's life to active love of God and neighbour.

consuming His Body and Blood, we consume His very essence to abide in Him. The Eucharistic meal is a participation in the very life of Christ in order to be transformed personally in the same way that food and drink nourish and transform a person. The Mass, Eucharist, is the great school of Jesus where we learn about the Christian life, Christ's love, our own dignity as Christians, our mission in life, and our unity. Never miss the opportunity to participate in Eucharistic celebrations. May God bless, protect, and keep us safe for the rest of the Semester. Pax!
