### Sowing Seed: Fruitful Harvest of the Good Soil

Dear People of God, we celebrate the Fifteenth Sunday duces a terrific harvest of thirty, sixty, and hundred in Ordinary Time, Year A. The readings invite us to grains for what was sown. Just as a plant can grow well celebrate Christ who came to sow the seed of God's on good soil, so the Word of God bears fruit in a good Word in the world, and we rejoice with Him as we see heart. Hence, a good disposition is necessary for a heart around us the first fruits of the Spirit. It is a call to re-flect on the relation between the Seed (Word of God) and the Soil/Grounds (the human heart). Jesus speaks in schools, hospitals, caritas, outreach programmes, reliparables in order to create opportunities for deep reflection on the lessons that are hidden in the daily events of our lives. The pledge is that the seed that falls on good grounds yields a fruitful harvest.

As disciples of Christ, sometimes we do ask, if the Word of God is a word of life, salvation, and power, a word that can heal, rescue, and revive, then why does it get a mixed response? St Matthew provides us with an answer in today's Gospel. Jesus uses examples of what people are used to, especially from nature, to communicate deep and heavenly messages. In the Gospel, He speaks of a farmer who goes out to sow and the various results from different soil forms. Out of the many ways of planting, the sower chooses a planting method that is just to scatter seeds, all over the place. The seed, (Word This can be said of every Christian. When something of God), fell on different soils: some fell on the road; some on rocky ground; some on thorn bush-covered ground; and some on good ground. The seed, the message that Jesus gives, is packed with power and salva-tion, especially for a world that, as St Paul says in the second reading, is groaning for redemption, for release our ability. That is what the Lord expects from us as the from the grip of sin and diseases. The seed is indeed Church, Christians, leaders, parents, guardians, educa-good, powerful, and effective, the difference lies in the tors, supervisors, superiors, colleagues, and friends. Afsoil which receives it.

Beloved, like the crowds gathered about Jesus for him to teach them, the Word of God comes to us from various sources in the form of homilies, preaching, teachings, education, advice, counsel, lectio divina, and through our reading of Scriptures. Sometimes our hearts are like that of the road or pavement, we tune out or let the seed/ message pass us by. We lack the courage to apply the message to ourselves but to others. At times too, our hearts are like the rocky ground, where the seed has no roots. We become so much interested in passionate, oratorical fireworks, and great emotional hypes, and afterward, go back to business as usual. The word among thorns is like those of us who have a running debate with a messenger: our concern is whether he/she used this word and not that, whether it was too harsh, Dear Students, Happy 65th Anniversary to you all. Hope too fuzzy, too conservative, too liberal, too academic, too devotional, too long, too short, too loud, too under-tone/soft, too fast, too slow, to the point, too clear, or did or did not address a particular issue.

The seed of God's Word truly bears fruit in proportion to our disposition towards welcoming the Word and allowing it to challenge and transform our lives. What kind of soil are we then? Are we filled with thorns, interests, addictions, distractions, other priorities, desires, and uncontrolled drives that choke off the Word of God in our lives? The question is not so much about whether we hear God's Word in our life: We do! It comes to us through the Scriptures and the Liturgy. But the question is whether we respond to it, embrace it, and let it take Have a Fruitful and Blessed Week! root and grow in our lives.

In this simple parable Jesus affirms that when a seed falls on good soil, it lets out roots and shoots and pro-

to bear fruit. Faith in Christ is handed on to the Church to grow and bear fruits. All that we see in the Church: gious orders, parishes, and the commitment of so many people to the work of the Gospel, are products of seed in good soil. We must also nurture the faith we received by taking care of the soil; weeding out where necessary. This implies that we ought to prune our attitudes and behaviours, and weed out whatever destroys, serve as a hindrance, and affects our relationship with God and with one another. Let us not judge the power of the seed by the seed that falls on pavement, rock, or thorns, but by the seed that falls on good soil. The power of God's Word is not seen in nominal Christians but in what it does in the lives of those who deeply embrace it. We cannot judge the Church by its sinners but by its saints: that is where we see the power of God's Word.

happens to people we have given help/advice, or they do something destructive/harmful, we instinctively want to know where we went wrong. This parable says to us that we did not necessarily do anything wrong. All we could do is sow the seed, by word and example, to the best of ter doing our part, the mysterious chemistry between the seed and the soil takes over. Jesus encourages us to sow to the best of our ability, to spread His Word as effectively and honestly as we know how and leave the rest to the mysterious chemistry between seed and soil. Some will surely take root and will make the sowing worthwhile. We are to keep sowing no matter how the soil may look because we never know when or where it will take root and produce a harvest of a changed-life and in turn change others. Sow widely and generously, there will be a harvest. Our patience, resourcefulness, and hard work, coupled with divine providence, will surely yield a harvest. May the soil of our hearts too be receptive to the Word of God and carry it out through the presence of the Holy Spirit.
