by their questionable morals, constituted a visible class of sinners. They were certainly thought of as excluded from the Kingdom because prostitution is forbidden in the Bible (Lev 19:29; Mt 5:27; 1Cor 6:13). It was taken

for granted that such people were incapable of repentance, or of welcoming the grace of God. But the unthinkable happened! Many of those excluded by the religious community responded to Jesus' preaching. They repent and believe in the Good News. Jesus thus breaks down religious and social barriers to show that in

breaks down religious and social barriers to show that in the Kingdom what counts is not statutes but the heart with which one receives the Good News.

Our society tends to think of street people as criminals,

those we fail to understand as witches. The readings remind us that prostitutes, tax collectors, garage boys, street urchins, prisoners, and all those we see as the odd

assortment of degeneration, are finding their way to heaven through a sincere act of conversion and obedi-

ence to God's Word. Every saint has a past and every sinner has a future! We need not fear if we turn away

from the path of virtue for the Lord is ever ready to for-give us if we but repent. It is never too late to turn to God and do His will. The Lord's compassion and kind-ness are from of old. He offers everyone the opportunity to rethink our "no" by word and manner of our lives. We may come to Church daily, recite the Rosary, follow

Obedience In Word and Deed, Never Too Late!

Sunday in Ordinary Time (A). The readings call on us to follow our "Yes" to God with a life of obedience and love. We are also cautioned never to make assumptions about who the Lord will accept or reject. This is because there can be so much good in those we consider evil and there can be so much evil in those we consider evil and there can be so much evil in those we consider good. The joy is that God offers everyone the chance to change their minds, repent, and enter His Kingdom. God is interested in the Sincerity of Conversion and Obedience to His Word.

challenging virtues in every age and place. In the Gospel, the sons are guilty of disobedience as both of them violate the Fourth Commandment. The story makes the point that it is not enough to talk, one must also do God's will as our actions show what is deep down in our hearts. Neither of the sons does that. These two sons are still very present in us. Like all parables, this story says something everybody can relate to: either being a parent of disobedient sons or being a son reluctant to work in the father's business. All of us can feel at home in the world of the story and say "Yes", this is me! But soon we realize that this is not simply an innocent, harmless story. It is really our own lives. Jesus proposes a new way of living and opens up new possibilities of human existence. Like the two sons, each of us has to make a choice to follow Jesus' invitation or otherwise. We are exhorted to behave like the first son and work in the Father's vineyard and not be like the second who agrees but does not go in the end. The faithful son represents all who, however reluctantly or painfully, obey Christ. The second son symbolizes Christians who reject Christ

Jesus initially addressed His story to the chief priests, elders of Israel, and the scribes who questioned His authority. There are first for the chief priests, and the scribes who questioned His authority. thority. They, out of overfamiliarity and contempt, disobey God, and out of spiritual pride makes it impossible for them to recognize that they are sinners in need of God's mercy. They are invited to rethink their positions and change their attitudes towards Jesus. They understood His challenge but refused to change. In the end, they became so furious and wanted to arrest him. Like the second son, the priests and Pharisees at first had said me second son, the priests and Pharisees at first had said "Yes" to a special relationship with God as God's people. They were the chosen people but when in Jesus God challenges them to enter His Kingdom they refuse. They find reasons and justifications not to believe in Him and even want everybody else to reject Christ. The tax collectors and sinners, however, behaved like the first son. At first, they seemed to have said "No" to God by their sinful lives. But having met Jesus, they think twice about their initial answer: they repent and come to faith about their initial answer: they repent and come to faith in Jesus. The good news is that whether we are like the first or second son, there is always the grace of repent-
