tation to God's Banquet, a banquet spread before all of us. It is a banquet that can satisfy our needs, yet how often have we refused, ignored, or rejected the Lord's invitation to share in the riches prepared for us? In Christ Jesus, God fulfils all our needs, as lavishly as only God can All of us no matter how unworthy we only God can. All of us, no matter how unworthy we may be, are invited to the wedding feast of His Son. We have only to enter. To answer God's invitation is not enough. Our lives must change.

The banquet of the finest wine and food, a favourite image of Messianic times, is used to describe the peace and joy of the Kingdom of God by the prophet Isaiah in our first reading and by Jesus in our Gospel text. The picture Isaiah paints in the first reading is that of a vast banquet on the Lord's mountain. For people in the Middle East and for us, a meal is not just a time to eat, it is a social occasion. It is a time to be with family and friends, to make deals, become acquainted, make plans, talk, and even say goodbyes. Lots of things happen at meals besides eating: we attend common breakfasts, retirement dinners, friend's lunches, office parties, wedbonding, a time when people draw closer together such as gathering at Christmas, anniversaries, birthdays, and special occasions. 
