Love God and Love Your Neighbour As Yourself!

Dear People of God, we celebrate today the Thirtieth most times exploited economically and emotionally; the Sunday in Ordinary Time (A). The Liturgical readings poor, weak, and vulnerable are mostly oppressed and call us to reflect on the greatest commandment of the condemned to live in misery and impoverishment. Our Law: Love. We are to love the Lord with our whole readings challenge every Christian to welcome the heart and our neighbour as ourselves. In fulfilling these two great commandments, we hope to become models of faith and imitators of the Lord who gave Himself totally for our sakes. With the strength that Christ gives us, we can celebrate with the joy of the Holy Spirit this great Commandment of Love which once had to be imposed on humanity under threat of God's avenging anger.

In today's Gospel reading, there is a tricky question for Jesus. The Sadducees tried, without success, to ridicule and shame Jesus' teachings about the Resurrection with the story of the woman who had seven husbands (Mt 22:23-33). They now try with a question about the most important Law. There was no agreement or consensus among the religious groups about this question. If Jesus responded in one way or the other, He would have taken sides for the one group against the other. A lawyer asked: which is the greatest commandment of the Law? Jesus replied: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your God and neighbour are inseparable. One cannot claim to love God and hate his neighbour. The love Jesus teaches today is an all-inclusive love: one that is committed to the good of the other. The "other" can be anybody or anything. Jesus' answer summarizes our Christian faith. When we love, it must be unconditional, unlimited, and entire. It appears easy to say and repeat when asked, yet difficult and challenging to practice. To know the right answer without living it is not the way of Christ.

The Commandments of God or the "Law", concern two realities: the relationship between people and God; and the people themselves. Israel was conscious that one cannot love God without loving other people who are created in God's Image and Likeness. The love of God was especially to be shown to the poor and the needy. The Wisdom Books stress that to insult the poor is to insult their Creator (Prov 14:31; 17:5) while to help them is to lend to God (Prov 19:7). The Prophets equal-ly insist that the only sacrifice and fasting pleasing to God is to behave justly, especially to those whose rights have been denied (Am 5:21-24; Is 58; 61:1-3). St Mat-thew's well-known parable about the Last Judgment, where Jesus identifies Himself with the hungry, stranger, sick, homeless, etc., (Mt 25:40,45) affirms the idea that the most vulnerable in our communities and parables and our love and in doing a wa show love to Societies need our love and in doing so we show love to God. In the Gospel, Jesus shows that loving God with all our heart, mind and soul comes first; but the love of one's neighbour has necessarily got to accompany it if it is to be authentic. They are really two sides of the same coin and cannot be separated from each other. This kind of love does not come naturally or easily: that is why we must "will" it. It is a conscious act done in the name and for the sake of God.

The first reading from Exodus helps to understand and makes practicable the great Commandment by expand-ing it and inviting us to be compassionate and benevolent toward the most vulnerable in society. Such people include the strangers, widows, orphans, the poor, and the suffering. In our world today, we mostly find situa-tions so contrary to this Biblical teaching: strangers are

stranger, empower the weak, provide for the poor and needy, and comfort the afflicted. As true disciples of Christ, love alone must rule our lives, constantly and consistently reflecting the compassionate and loving face of Jesus who loves unconditionally.

May we not be caught up in showing our love of God through long prayers and spiritual activities while we refuse and neglect any practical involvement with the poor in our locality. Praying to God we do not see is not as disturbing to us as the poor and the excluded who live among us. Our faith as Christians, however, always challenges us to see God in each other and to acknowledge that we cannot obey the first great com-mandment and neglect the second. The Law is Love of God and Love of neighbour. They are the two legs of a healthy, transforming, impactful Christian. We cannot have a private, personal spirituality, independent and isolated from the world around us; nor can we love our an your neart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind... you shall love your neighbour as yourself". In His answer, Jesus goes beyond the debate to a real-life spent in loving God and one's neighbour. Christ put the love of God and neighbour on equal footing: the love of God and neighbour are inseparable. One cannot claim to the love of God and neighbour are inseparable. Love of God and neighbour are two legs of our Christian life and we need them both.


