Do You Have What It Takes To Welcome the Lord? Be Prepared!

Dearest People of God, we celebrate the Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time (A). The Liturgical readings invite us to be prepared. Though we seek many things in this life, we are encouraged to seek first the Lord and His Wisdom. For by so doing, we will be keeping wisdom. In doing so, we will be keeping vigil for the Lord as we await in joyful hope His return is glory. He vigil for the Lord as we await His joyful return in glory. The whole of the Christian life, our response to the love of Christ, our waiting with joyful hope for His Are you prepared for the Master's return? November is coming, is summed up in a single word: Wisdom. He a time to think about and pray for the dead – not to be must find us prepared and ever ready for His return.

Jesus in our Gospel today gives us the parable about the ten bridesmaids, the first of whom were foolish and the other five wise. Being excluded from a wedding was a serious tragedy for maidens or bridesmaids in Jesus' time. In those days, there were no "singles groups or sites", and no specific places where one could meet young single men. A wedding was a sure Master's return.

Oil is key in today's parable. Oil is a vital part of human life then and now. It has domestic and religious uses. We use oil in our cars and machines, we use it at home and in cooking. It is medicinal, protects the body, and is used for painting and for lamplight. The Church uses oil in four of the Sacraments: Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Orders, and the Sacrament of the Sick, Oil tion, Holy Orders, and the Sacrament of the Sick. Oil represents the gifts of the Holy Spirit, the strengthening, healing, and enlightening power of the Holy Spirit. The tragedy of the parable is that, though oil is available – even at midnight one could get some from dealers – five of the bridesmaids ran out of oil. They had beautiful containers, magnificent lamps, but they were empty of oil. This can happen to any Christian. We can run out of oil the strengthening of God's grace in our life. out of oil, the strengthening of God's grace in our life. It is the "oil" of grace that enables us to be in the presence of God, to easily speak with God in prayer, to maintain a sense of our spiritual dignity no matter what people may do to us, and to live our life according to the Gospel rather than be manipulated by popular culture. Our oils can run out through neglect when we do not nourish our spiritual life; when we say lots of prayers but are never "in prayer", nor in communication with the Lord. A crisis often comes and we are not prepared. We may have a beautiful vessel, a great appearance, but we may be running empty. Our spiritual life, our soul is dry. The oil has run out.

The other point of the parable is that there are some things we cannot borrow from others. This is the point of the wise bridesmaids not lending any oil. The foolish maidens knew that the groom could come any time in the night but still did not prepare themselves, ignored the importance of the occasion, and paid the price. Every Christian is filled with oil at Baptism, at Confirmation, at Marriage, Profession, or Ordination. However, we can run out of oil and empty our souls of our spiritual vitality when we do not live each day in our spiritual vitality when we do not live each day in Have a Fruitful and Blessed Week! the light of Jesus' teachings. Sadly, we cannot borrow someone else's faith, grace, virtues, holiness, goodness, or spirituality. We are responsible before God for our own spiritual condition: what we do with the oils given to us. We blame the world for many things but not the state of our souls. That is up to us. The wise are

> As Christians, we believe in the Resurrection of the dead: a hope we have through the Resurrection of Jesus Christ our Lord. The second reading is very consoling in this respect. St Paul offers us hope not to mourn our departed relatives/friends like those who have no hope. As we think of death and dying in this month, we may come to see that each day in our life is a grace, a time to know Jesus Christ more fully. None of us knows when the Lord will come to us. Whenever He comes, we know our lamps will be burning ready like the wise bridesmaids, filled with oil, because it is always filled with oil and burning ready all the time, with the oil of righteousness and good deeds.

> November is a time to Remember, Visit, and offer Prayers for our Departed Faithful. It is an occasion to deepen our Faith in the Resurrection. This is the beauty of our Catholic Faith. May the Souls of the Faithful Departed, through the Mercy of God, Rest in Peace.
