Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe!

Dear People of God, today, the Thirty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time (A) is the Last Sunday of the Church Liturgical Year. On this Last Sunday of the Year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity in honour of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, to bring the year to an end. Next week is Advent and the start of a new Liturgical Year. This Sunday is dominated by the familiar parable of the sheep and the goats, the very last parable Jesus told in Matthew's Gospel. It is a grand and sweeping scene in which Jesus is pictured as a King rendering Judgment. It is a moment when all the nations will be gathered together and people will be divided into two groups by the Lord Jesus, our Good Shepherd. At the end of time, at His coming, He will hand over the Kingdom to His Father. He will "judge between one sheep and another, between rams and goats", between those who have lived their lives for others, and those who have lived for themselves.

God is the true King over the whole universe. Christ delivered the kingdom to God the Father after destroying every rule, every authority, and every power. He must reign until all His enemies are put under His feet, the last of which is death. He accomplished this through His resurrection. As a royal shepherd, Christ is leading us to the Kingdom of His Father. Human conditions are such that many look to Jesus as King to establish and rule His Kingdom with power, wealth, honour, fame, name, glory, justice, and fairness. The parable of the last judgment shows that there will be an end to everything. At this end-time, God, as King and Judge, will judge everybody according to how faithful we have been in performing acts of loving-kindness. In fact, everybody will be rewarded according to his or her deeds of love. The measure by which everyone will be tested or rewarded is "What you did for the least of my brothers, you did to me". Our God is a King who is present in the poor and needy of our world at all times. Those who act with charity towards the hungry and thirsty, the sick and suffering, prisoners and strangers, would have acted well toward Him. They will be rewarded (as sheep to His right). Those who neglect the needy also neglect the King. They will be punished (as goats to His left).

Jesus teaches us that judgment is happening here and now through our actions. It is not something reserved for some distant time in the future. The future will only confirm the truth of the life we are currently living. Hence, the call to be sensitive to the needs of the people around us and offer them the needed help when possible. Our help to people should be motivated only by the love of Christ. We cannot separate Christ from His apostles, disciples, people, Church, and Christians. How we respond to any needy person is our response to Christ and every good deed done for the love of Christ is actually done to Christ. If we want to reign with Him eternally in His heavenly Kingdom, we have to feed the hungry, quench the thirst of the thirsty, take care of the sick, clothe the naked, alleviate suffering, visit those in prison, welcome and shelter the stranger, and such others. A test case for us is to ask ourselves if we have cared for the least among us through the Corporal or Spiritual Works of Mercy.

In our communities today, there are many people who go to bed hungry, those who are homeless and harassed by people, sick people who cannot afford medical treatment, and prisoners held in inhuman conditions as they await trial. The challenge is to recognize God in them and to show our love by what we do and not merely in words. The needy may disturb our comfort but they are a constant reminder that the goods of this earth are

meant for all of us. Jesus reminds us that sharing what we have with them is not an option but a duty. Giving them the means to live a decent life is not a privilege we accord them but their right. In addition, the sin of those left out of the Kingdom and sent to eternal fire (as goats to His left) is not that they caused harm to those in need; they did not cause their hunger, nakedness, imprisonment, sickness, made them strangers, or their misery. Their sin is that they did nothing (the sin of omission). They were somehow indifferent to their plight. They looked the other way. This means that we will be judged not only for what we do but also for what we fail to do.

Our Gospel is truly a majestic and challenging one. The impressive images challenge us to take sides and mend our lives. It is first of all, about Jesus Christ, the King and Judge of history, all of history, and every person's history. It speaks about our responsibility for others in body or in spirit as the most reliable proof of our loyalty to Christ. It is a plain truth that we can be separated from God not only for doing wrong/evil but also for doing nothing: "Whatever you do to the least of these, you do to me. What you failed to do for them, you failed to do for me". These words are both comforting and disturbing because they teach us that the proof of how much we love the Lord, of how much He is alive in us, is found not in spiritual theatrics but in how we treat others around us. It is mostly hard to see Christ in others; however, we can easily be Christ to others. To be Christ to others speaks the truth about us, the depth of our faith, and our eternal destiny. The image of sheep and goat, being separated from each other, tells us that we shall be judged according to our docility or lack of docility to God who invites us to recognize and serve Him in the needy. Charity, they say, begins at home. How do we react in the face of human suffering at home, workplace, within our nuclear or extended family, relatives, friends, colleagues, and communities?

Next week, we all have the opportunity as individuals, families, groups/societies, and a community of believers to Thank God for all His Mercies, Blessings, Favours, Protection, and Loving Care in our lives. Let us come to give Thanks to God in our own unique ways. God bless you.

Congratulations to the Graduating Class of 2023. Ayekoo! Be a true and proud ambassador of KNUST! We also share the joys of all our school leavers. Our prayer for you is to get the chance into your schools of choice. Take good care of yourselves and lend a helping hand at home. Let Christ be the King of your entire life. Be a sheep on His right hand because of your loving kindness toward the needy. Do not forget your Bibles and Catechism. Be interested in knowing more about God, His Church, and our Moral Life. Please, let your presence be felt in your parishes; the Church needs you most! May God crown our efforts with success. God bless, protect, and keep us safe. Pax!

Please be reminded to stay well, healthy, and safe. Be not afraid to attend Mass. Remember to observe the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us!
