Christian, Witness the Peace, Presence and Purpose of Christ!

"Peace be with you".

Dear People of God, we celebrate the Third Sunday of Easter. With the assurance that Christ is Risen, the readings invite us to bear witness to the wonders of the Lord: His peace, presence and purpose. Having enjoyed Christ's peace, and being assured of His presence, we are to proclaim the marvels of the Lord: the suffering Messiah, raised from the dead, has been glorified and offers new life. This Jesus, the Risen and Glorified Lord, is our intercessor, and our offering for sin, our peace. Christ also gives us a new understanding of the Scriptures and sends us out to be His witnesses. We celebrate with the living Christ, our advocate with the Father, in whose name repentance for the forgiveness of sins is preached to humanity.

St Peter, in the Acts of the Apostles, gave his speech in line with the classic Lukan pattern and a typical apostolic discourse on the Resurrection: recollection of circumstances; proclamation of the resurrection; appeal to the Scriptures; and exhortation to conversion. The last component of the apostolic discourse, that is the exhortation to conversion, is particularly prominent in today's text: "Repent, therefore, and be converted (turn again), that your sins may be wiped away (blotted out)". Thus, Peter invites the Jewish people to repent of their sin of rejecting and crucifying Jesus, the Holy and Righteous One. With faith in the Risen Christ comes conversion, forgiveness of sins and new life. On the Cross, Jesus had said, "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do". Peter does the same by telling the people that they and their leaders knew not what they were doing. Though the works of the people led to the killing of the "prince of life" and the demand of a murderer's release in his place, God's love is always the victor and succeeds in drawing good even from the worst actions of man. This indicates that conversion is the primary aim of the apostolic witness. When we excuse people who offend us, we liberate ourselves from hurt and gain the power to forgive from the heart. In that case, we offer them the chance and opportunity for reconciliation and to experience peace.

St Luke's takes us back to the Upper Room where the disciples, returning from Emmaus, narrated their encounter with the Risen Jesus. They shared with the other disciples what had happened, only to experience once again the appearance of the Risen One. The narrative follows a familiar pattern: Jesus appears, greets the disciples with "Shalom" (Peace), and then invites them to dine with him. In the course of the meal, He breaks open the Scriptures for them, and ends with a command that they are to be "witnesses of these things". Through these appearances, the Lord takes this group of disciples, broken apart, dispirited, and scattered by His crucifixion and death, and re-creates them together around the truth of His Resurrection. In the appearance, the Risen Lord established the features that will be Please be reminded to stay well, healthy, and safe. Be not afraid to part of every authentic Christian community until the end of time: that attend Mass. Remember to observe the safety protocols. Your life is is His Peace, Presence, and Purpose. The Risen Lord's first words to the disciples are "Peace be with you". He gives them His peace because they are in turmoil, confusion, agitated, guilt. These "followers" had abandoned and denied Him despite their strong claims that they God bless and keep you safe. would do otherwise. They knew that they betrayed their Master. They were sorry but could not turn back the clock. Jesus knows of their Our Lady of the Holy Rosary, Pray for Us. repentance. He comes now to offer them "Peace"; to let them know that they are forgiven. That was what turned their fear into joy: they were forgiven.

The message of Jesus at every Mass and in all our Sacraments is forgiveness that comes from repentance. Forgiveness and repentance go together. Regrettably, people try to separate them. Some people love

repentance and do it all the time but do not really believe that there is forgiveness for them. Others want forgiveness but without repentance. However, when we put them together, we have a wonderful Easter truth. No matter what we may have done, whatever our past, however horrible the things we did, our repentance can bring new life, forgiveness, and peace. We can become a new creation because "Christ is expiation for our sins". St John writes in the second reading, "If anyone does sin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the Righteous One". A similar thing is what St Peter says, "Repent that your sins may be wiped away". The peace that comes from forgiveness is Jesus' first great Easter gift to the Apostles who needed it at that crucial moment, and to us who need it today. There is always forgiveness because the love of God cannot be overcome by our sins or ignorance. First, acknowledge the evil we have done, our frailty and sinfulness, then let us change our lives.

The Risen Lord assures us of His presence, His real presence among us. Christ is truly among us through His Holy Spirit when we pray and when we gather with our fellow Christians in faith. He is present in the Eucharist as the most vivid way He would remain with us. He is with us not as a memory or a model but as surely as He was with the Apostles in the Upper Room. Christ's presence is a wonderful gift to us believers. As we look at all the individuals in the Church, we can reflect on the fact that the Risen Lord is at work in the lives of each of us, each with his or her own story, needs, and aspirations, and He is present to each as though that person were the only one. He comes to each one of us in His Word and in the Eucharist with the particular graces that each needs for his/her life. This enduring, lasting, permanent, real presence of Christ to us is His gift to us as a community of believers. Besides His peace and presence, there is also His purpose. Meeting the Risen Jesus always conveys a renewed understanding of what it means to be His follower. The Lord sent the Apostles to be witnesses of this new way of life, the new truth that entered the universe: that in our world there is a new creation at work and growing. The Church has many great, heroic witnesses to Christ's life and teaching. There are many saints, canonized and not yet canonized, who had a mission to fulfil. We too are given a purpose. We can make some Easter resolutions such as sharing the peace and the presence of Christ with others or at least with one other person. We can equally sow seeds of love, care, truth, honesty, fairness, and fidelity in our communities. Let us try to share something of Christ with others.

We continue to pray with and for our dear students and wish them all the best in their exams. The victory and triumph of the Risen Lord is with you. Have no fears! Be disciplined, do your part with honesty, and God will supply the rest. Victoria is assured. Pax!
