Do Not Fear, Only Believe: Jesus Still Heals!

"The Lord be with you".

Dear People of God, together with Holy Mother Church we celebrate the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B. The Liturgical readings for today reveal to us that if we have not met Jesus, then we have not yet received our total healing. They call on us not to fear but to have faith because Jesus still performs His healing work among us. Faith leads to healing and new life.

Most of us have witnessed the "before" and "after" pictures used to advertise diet foods, exercise equipment, gymnasium and plastic surgery. We may have also experience people in bad shape that they can make a living as a professional. Today's readings give us the "before" and "after" scenes in three extracts. The first reading from the Book of Wisdom describes our world as if it came fresh from the hand of the Creator God. We are told that "God did not make death, He fashioned all things that they might exist, and the creatures of the world are wholesome, and there is no destructive poison in them. For God created man for incorruption". It shows us that creation, our world, was filled with the life of God. Then something happened! But "through the devil's envy death entered the world". This refers to the split from God that ruptured creation in the original sin. Thus, because of the devil and sin, sickness and death entered the world. It is as though God's creation was a magnificent and splendid glass window, everything fits together, and then suddenly it was shattered. The shattered glass (world with sin) is the scene two, the "after" scene of creation, which is the world we know. Like the shattered glass, we can pick up each of the pieces of glass and see a little of the beauty of the original creation still there.

We are most likely aware of how all the magnificent pieces of God's creation broken from the rest (like the glass) develop sharp edges which at times harm us. We see how human sexuality — meant to transmit life — when separated from its purpose in marriage can dominate a person's life, even obsess a person and occupy his/her every thought and action. We know how human drive and ambition — the mind's capacity to discover, invent, improve a community, shape the world, build a city, discover new territories as in going to the moon — can trample on people and even nations. We know how indulgence in drugs, food and drinks — meant for medication, nutrition and socialization — can destroy a life, family, and a society. We know how human beings by the evils and crimes they commit with their free will can turn a family, community or city in a war zone and how even technology can serve sinister purposes like the temptations of the internet. In each of these cases, the power of the original creation is still in them, but it is broken off from its centre, and the pieces no longer easily fit together. The inner harmony, coherence, and link to God that held everything together were lost by original sin.

Jesus came to put the broken pieces together into a new creation. We see that in the scene three (the "after" that scene) in the Gospel of today. Jesus restores a small girl to life and her family, and heals a woman with the "flow of blood" for many years because of their faith. By the healing, the Lord Jesus not only cures her illness but also restores her to community and social life. Throughout the Gospels, we witness Jesus in His teaching, miracles and now through His Church and the Holy Spirit, putting together the broken pieces of creation. But do all the pieces fit together in our life or we keep cutting ourselves on the broken edges? We could be satisfied with our broken world, look at the broken pieces and sigh a sigh of regret about original sin. On the other hand, we can profess faith and trust that repairs and healing can take place, and is on-going, in our lives and among people. The message of the Gospel is that we should not settle for broken pieces or broken lives. Jesus can help us put the pieces together; in our lives and in our world. But, like the woman in the Gospel, we must first reach out to Him in faith, go to Him, and come to Him. Mostly, we seek to mend our lives in the externals by changing neighbourhood, getting new job, new clothes, and new therapists; when in actual fact what we really need is healing and mending on the inside. Jesus offers us that deeper and profound healing, because He heals from the inside out. In fact, He is a wonderful, wise and efficient physician, always on call.

Our desire for justice, the yearning for peace, doing right, the search for perfect love and faithful friendship, are all pieces of the first creation in our lives. They are signs of God's initial creation that can be repaired in Christ's new creation. Those pieces of the initial creation built into us are still there, just that they are disordered by sin. Jesus can bring healing into our life. That is why the Church remembers and proclaims His miracles to us today. He can give as peace: tranquillity of order, everything in its proper place, doing what it was intended to do. A careful look at the two narratives in the Gospel of today shows that until we have met Jesus in faith, we have not yet received our total healing. The woman with the flow of blood had spent all her fortunes and resources without a cure. Touching the fringe of Jesus' garment healed her. Jairus, president of the synagogue, also called on Jesus and his daughter was brought back to life. In both instances, true faith in Christ was demonstrated. The two stories also illustrate the healing power of Jesus. Medical science has indeed come a long way in healthcare, in curing diseases and illnesses, but there is One whose power far exceeds that of science. Hence, doctors can, and must, do their best in providing care, but it is ultimately Jesus who heals. Jesus hears the cry of those in need, healing the sick and raising the dead to life. He made himself poor that we might become rich.

To all who celebrate their Birthdays, various Anniversaries and special Thanksgiving for God's intervention in their lives in the month of June, we say Happy and Blessed Birthday and Anniversary! May you continue to enjoy the Blessings and Favours of God.

We pray for and wish our dear students a Fruitful and Successful Mid-Semester Examinations. Do your best and God will supply the rest. Be of good conduct. Good Luck!
