Cut Off In Order To Gain Heaven!

"The Lord be with you".

Dear People of God, we celebrate today the Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B. In the readings Moses and Jesus attest to the fact that the work of the Spirit cannot be confined by an institution and that no one can claim a monopoly of the Spirit's charism. Learn to "cut off" and beware of growing and piling up riches while neglecting the rights and needs of others.

Because Moses alone was not able to meet all the needs of the Israelite community, God decides that the charismatic gifts of Moses, including prophecy, should be shared with others. However, he and Joshua, his trusted assistant, disagree on whether these gifts are legitimate in those who were not present when the gifts were originally bestowed as in the case of Eldad and Medad. This is a clear example of fanaticism and envy that we sometimes harbour, often unconsciously, towards those who do good but not part of our group. Many are those individuals, organizations and movements, who complement and assist the good work the Church is doing. They may not carry the name "Christian" but are moved by a Spirit they cannot name and are doing the work of the Lord they do not know. They may not be members of the Church, but they are our allies in the work of the Lord. The generous view of Moses should prevail: "would that all the people of the Lord were prophets". We see the essential freedom of God whose gifts can never be completely limited or subject to institutional control. There is the need to recognize such people as allies and not enemies.

Today's Gospel reading is a series of four sayings related by catchwords. The sayings contain quite diverse thematic material. The saying concerning exorcists is followed by the promise of a reward for those who help the disciples in the course of fulfilling their mission of bearing witness to the name of Christ. Next we see that to cause another to sin, especially someone powerless or innocent (scandal), is especially abhorrent and earns divine retribution. Drowning was a Roman punishment, and would have been considered barbaric by a Jewish audience, thus emphasizing the gravity and severity of the crime. The final saying talks about the depth of fear one should have toward even the possibility of being cut off from God by sin. If your eye, arm, leg is causing you to sin, cut it off. Jesus is not advocating self-mutilation. Rather, he is using a vivid Sematic style of extreme contrasts to make his point: there is nothing worse than sin. Sin, at all costs, is to be avoided.

"Gehenna", a name equivalent to "hell", was an actual place in South Jerusalem that was turned into a dump where the city's garbage was burned. Its dreadful associations with fire, decay, refuse, filth, and death made it a terrifying symbol of the punishments of the damned. We learn that heaven is for those who can go through the process of "cutting off" or letting go. While the world strives to preserve life with its consumerist world-view, Christians must strive to "cut off" or sacrifice, in order to gain heaven. To reach heaven we must learn to cut ourselves off part by part, day by day, until nothing of ourselves remains but everything of God. Thus, we must cut off pride for humility to grow; cut off egoism that altruism may grow; cut off lust that love may prosper; cut off laziness to give way to hard work. We must cut off anger that there may be inner peace; cut off the noisy world that silence may be heard; cut off negative friendship or influence to give way to authentic companions. We must get blocking devices for the internet; throw away that CD; read books instead of television/media; close that account; delete that folder or website; distance ourselves from that relationship; when they are causing us to sin. It is in dying to vices that we cultivate virtues. Virtues give us the strength to move closer to God. When we succeed in cutting off the unwanted elements, heaven becomes a living reality here and now.

Dear students on vacation, take very good care of yourselves, be helpful to your families, and be true ambassadors of our school. We have the opportunity to deepen our faith and improve our spiritual life by reading something about the faith and the Church. We pray for journey mercies upon all travelling. We love you and miss you already!

To our SHS Examination Candidates, be assured of our prayers. Finish hard! Fear not, God is in control. Be of good conduct, do your best and God will supply the rest. Victory is assured!

Please, remember to stay well, healthy and safe. Be not afraid to attend Mass. Get vaccinated when you have the opportunity. Continue to wear your nose mask and observe all the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us!
