## Go, Sell All That You Have, and Follow Me

"The Lord be with you".

Dear People of God, we celebrate today the Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B. Our readings this weekend invite us to reflect on the theme of "choice".

In our Gospel reading, we have a rich man coming to Jesus with a question. The Gospel does not say precisely when or where this took place. Neither does it tell us the name of the man because it could be any person, place and time. The question, however, is a universal one: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" It is a question of every culture, place and people. Jesus answers him directly: keep the commandments! This man replies that he has done that but still he wanted more, he needed more. Jesus looked at him with love and said to him: "You lack one thing. Go, sell what you have, give to the poor, then follow me". And there was a great silence. The man left sad, "for he had many possessions".

This person lived a moral life yet felt that something was holding him back. The depth of spiritual life was eluding him because something stood in the way. Jesus spotted that "something" right away and made it known to him. He lacked freedom. He was possessed by his possessions. Those he could not give up. His wealth trapped him. "He went away sad, for he had many possessions". Maybe when Jesus looks at us, He sees other things that stand in our way of a vibrant spiritual life. It may not be money and wealth, for many people are generous with their prosperity. It could be lust, arrogance, envy, memory, wrong relationship, career, etc., that keep us from giving ourselves completely to the Christ's work.

The second reading exhorts that the Word of God is able to perform a spiritual diagnosis of our soul, allowing God's grace to do some spiritual surgery in us: cutting out moral tumours that block our full fellowship with Christ. We all have "something" that stands in the way of our deep following of Christ. The key is to identify it. Jesus did that for the rich man whiles God's Word, read and preached daily, can do that for us. For him, it was his possessions; for us it may be something else.

The Lord goes on to speak about the power of money to hypnotize us and distract us from the care of our soul. Sometimes our desire to get or keep money can hold us back from doing what we know is the right thing. The accumulation of wealth can cloud our judgment. But, it can also help us serve God and humanity. Money is a tool. The question is: What are we doing with it? Is it a burden to our soul or a blessing? A meditation from a book called *Prayer* by Michel Quoist can help us reflect on what we are doing with our money. It is called "Prayer Before a Twenty Dollar Bill" but in our case it could be "Prayer Before a Two-Hundred Ghana Cedis Note":

Lord, see this note. It frightens me. You know its secrets, you know its history. It will never tell all it hides in its creases. It will never reveal all the struggles and efforts it represents.

The disillusionment and slighted dignity. It is stained with sweat and blood. It frightens me because it has death on its conscience.... All the people who killed themselves for it; to possess it for a few hours; to have through it a little pleasure, a little joy, a little life....

It has offered roses to the radiant fiancée. It has paid for the baptismal party, and fed the baby. It has provided bread for the family table. Because of it there was laughing among the young and joy among the elders. It has paid for the saving visit of the doctor; it has bought the book that taught the child; it has clothed the young girl.

But it has sent the letter breaking the engagement; it has paid for the death of the baby in its mother's womb; it has bought the liquor that made the drunkard; it has produced the movie unfit for children; and has recorded the indecent song. It has broken the morals of the adolescent and made the adult a thief. It has bought for a few hours the body of a woman. It has paid for the weapons of crime and for the wood of the coffin.

O Lord, I offer you this bill [note] with its joyous mysteries; its sorrowful mysteries. I thank you for all the life and joy it has given. I ask your forgiveness for the harm it has done.

How are we using the money we have? Is it building the Kingdom of God or blocking it? Is it liberating our soul or trapping it? Is it building up our spiritual assets or depleting them? Are we better followers of Christ because of it or in spite of it? Money is a tool. What it does to our life and to our soul is up to us.

God bless and keep you safe.

May Mary accompany us all through the Month and Week.


