Position of Honour Equals Service!

"The Lord be with you".

Dear People of God, we celebrate today the Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B. The readings for this weekend invite us to reflect on the need to serve one another. True greatness (holiness) is found in serving one another and by giving ourselves as did Jesus Christ who suffered that we might be justified. He is our compassionate high priest in whom we have placed our hope.

Everyone likes to be in a place of honour. It is not sinful to desire an honourable position. But it is important to know and understand what it means to be in such positions. People see positions of honour as opportunities to serve themselves and trample on other persons. This is because they seek their own gain and not the good of the people. As Jesus and His disciples approached Jerusalem, Jesus reminds them for the third time that He will suffer, die and rise from the dead. As with the two previous announcements, the disciples fail to understand His teaching and He has to challenge them again. James and John, the sons of Zebedee, show how much they misunderstand Jesus when they ask for the places of honour in His Kingdom. Once more Jesus has to teach them and all who want to become His followers that to be His disciple is to become servants and even slaves to all, following His own example of total self-giving.

Jesus uses the ambition of James and John to admonish and to remind us that whatever position we occupy is for service. The request of these two could have been motivated by their personal ambition, desire for place of honour, or genuine desire to serve. In answer to their possible false expectation Jesus reminds them that He is going to Jerusalem not take possession of the town politically and to set up a messianic government, but instead to suffer, die and to rise again. The "Son of Man" came not to be served but to serve and give His life as a ransom for many. In the Church therefore, we should not have "leaders and heads" who issue orders and "subjects" who obey: a class of people who are respected, honoured, and full of privileges; and a lower class with not dignity. We are all sisters and brothers, and all must see ourselves as the servants of others.

In a world in which people are generally honoured when they come first or excel; people with authority are considered important and are rendered homage and service; Jesus teaches something different. In the Kingdom of Jesus, the leader is there, not to exploit others, or be honoured and served by them; but rather to be their servant and even their slave. One who becomes a Christian will have his/her value system turned upside down by Jesus' world view. The various abilities and talents we are granted by God are not to cause divisions, to help us rule over, or to compete with others. All our gifts and talents must be a source of communion and complementary. To be great means to be the last and the servant of all, just as Christ was.

The first reading from Isaiah tells us how God prepared His people to adopt the mentality of service and of giving up one's life for others. The suffering of the servant of God becomes an offering for sin; a blessing in seeing his/her offspring; a prolonging of his/her days; and the prospering of the work of his/her hands. Such a servant will see and enjoy the fruits of his/her hard work and be satisfied. The offering of his/her self leads to many being saved and accounted righteous. This idea of serving others is also affirmed by the second reading where the "Son of God" was not afraid to come down to the level of humanity. He willingly became one of us and shared our human condition except sin, inviting all His followers to have the courage to lower ourselves to the level of the least among us. Why do we look for leadership positions? Why do we expect people to refer to us by our titles rather than just by our names?

Today is World Mission Sunday. Holy Mother Church encourages all the faithful worldwide to assist in the Church's Mission of spreading the Gospel. Let us all contribute generously as our way of participating in the missionary activity of the Church and serving others.

Dear students on vacation, take good care of yourselves, be helpful to your families, and be true ambassadors of our school. We love you and we miss you already! To our SHS Leavers, we say Ayekoo! Congratulations for successfully completing SHS. We hope to see you more and involved in Church activities. Find time to deepen your faith and your understanding of the Church and Her doctrines as we pray for excellent outcome in the examinations.

Please, remember to stay well, healthy and safe. Be not afraid to attend Mass. Get vaccinated when you have the opportunity. Wear your nose mask and observe all the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us!

Beloved parishioners do not forget about your Rosary. The Rosary is a fortress against evil. May Mary accompany us all through the Month and Week.
