### Giving: Quality Offering, not Quantity

"The Lord be with you".

Dear People of God, we celebrate today the Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B. Our readings invite us to reflect on the proper way to perform our acts of charity. The readings teach us a very important spiritual truth that we cannot neglect if we desire our giving, offerings, and generosity to yield us God's blessings: the truth is that God is not so much concerned about the "quantity" of our offerings as with its "quality".

In the first reading, from the first Book of Kings, we hear of the poor widow from Zarephath who shared with the prophet Elijah all she had to live on. Indeed, it is the Lord who provided for Elijah's needs through the widow of Zarephath who shared with him from her insufficiency. Her generosity is mirrored in another widow in the Gospel reading who gives from her poverty and not from power, privilege, excess or superfluous. In the Gospel we hear Christ praise the generosity of this widow who put into the treasury all she had to live on. She gave her all, not holding back anything.

The second reading tells us of Christ who became poor for us, offering and sacrificing not bulls or sheep or animals but His own self for our sake, to take away our sins. These readings teach us the very important spiritual truth: that God is not so much interested or concerned about the quantity of our giving, offerings and generosity as with its quality. All that we can ever offer or give to God, money, animals, material things, etc., already belong to God. There is only one thing God awaits to receive from us: our free "Yes" to Him. God will not force us to love, accept or offer ourselves up to Him; that is why this is the only true offering.

Christ offered up Himself for us, the two widows offered all they had to live on: they offered their life. God does not need your wealth, He needs you. Are you ready to give or offer your very self to God and the Church instead of what you possess or have? What do you give or offer to God and the Church? Are you considering the quantity or the quality of your offering? What can we bring to offer as our gift to you, O Lord, O God? Father all that we are, all that we have comes from your hand.

Dear students on vacation, take good care of yourselves, be helpful to your families, and be true ambassadors of your schools. We love you and hope you miss us! We hope to see you more involved in Parish activities. Make the effort to deepen your faith and understanding of the Church and Her doctrines. In so doing, you will be forming your conscience against ideologies.

Please, remember to stay well, healthy and safe. Be not afraid to attend Mass. Get vaccinated when you have the opportunity. Wear your nose mask and observe all the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us!
