The End Time: Is Your Name in the Book?

"The Lord be with you".

Dear People of God, we celebrate today the Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B. Our readings for this weekend invite us to reflect on the End Times and the Second Coming of Christ. They tell us that at the end, the Son of Man will return with great power and glory, placing His enemies under His feet. Those whose names are in the Book shall live forever in light and joy.

These apocalyptic passages are disturbing readings, filled with ominous language about cosmic collapse and signs about end times. They tell of terrible events to come when the sun and the moon fail to give light. Everything on which people relied will fall apart. Even the Gospel, the Good News, seems to paint a gloomy picture of the end of time and the second coming of Christ. However, rather than feel fearful of these foretold events and occurrences, believers should feel consoled and expectant because the One who comes is not an unknown or a strange deity, breathing smoke and fire. We should be consoled and expectant because the centuries long conflict between good and evil, grace and sin, of which each of us is a part comes to an end. This perennial conflict between good and evil, grace and sin, the redeemed and unredeemed, is something we are all involved. It runs through neighbourhoods, churches, politics, governments, classrooms, cultures, unions, clubs, societies, businesses, sports, hospitals, entertainment as well as our lives.

In our daily lives, we experience pieces of this struggle between good and evil. This conflict will continue until the end of time. We should not be surprised when we find corruption and sin in any time and place. The assurance the readings offer us is that, in all these God's grace is and will be present. Even though, the Book of Daniel, today's first reading says that the end will be a time unsurpassed in distress since the nations began, it is quick to add that, "but your people, the chosen of God, shall escape". Michael, the great archangel, will come not as avenger but as protector. By God's grace, whatever will come at the end, God's people will be delivered and safe. Likewise in the Gospel, after describing the signs at the end, the Lord says, "the Son of Man will come to gather His chosen ones". Whenever, the end will come, God's grace will be there as well to bring salvation and strength to His people. These are good news for believers.

One thing the readings offer us is that, we do not know when the end will come. Hence, we are given God's grace and protection in our daily struggle. We have the Son of Man who comes to us in Word and Sacraments to give us His truth and grace. We have the great sacrifice of Christ with its forgiveness made present in every Mass. In addition, the One who comes was and is one of us; He is our brother and friend; He understands our weakness, difficulties and challenges. This is precisely the point of the second reading from the letter to the Hebrews: Jesus in His incarnation became one of us, and by His priestly self-immolation has taken away our sins once and for all. He calls us daily to unite ourselves to Him, so that where He is, we too shall be: seated at the right hand of the Father. May God's protection, grace and forgiveness aid us in our struggle against evil, sin. So many things come and go in our life, in our world. But the promise given in our readings is that in the end, the end of our life and at the end of our world, there will always be Christ. Courage, the liberation is near and at hand.

This weekend, the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Pope Francis, in his Apostolic Letter, *Misericordia et Misera* (20/11/2016) has designated it "World Day of the Poor". He wrote: "It will be a day that will help communities and each baptized person to reflect on how poverty is at the heart of the Gospel, and on the fact that, as long as Lazarus lies at the door of our homes (Lk 16:19-21) there can be no justice or social peace" (n. 21). Blessed are you who have thought of, prayed for, and offered to help the poor and needy. Thank you for your offering in cash and kind.

To our dear BECE Candidates, we are with you in prayers. God has heard your prayers. Your efforts will surely be crowned with success. Have no fears! Do your best and be of good conduct. God is in control. Victory is assured.

Please, remember to stay well, healthy and safe. Be not afraid to attend Mass. Get vaccinated when you have the opportunity. Wear your nose mask and observe all the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us!
