### Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

"The Lord be with you".

Dear People of God, we celebrate today the Thirty-Fourth or the Last Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B. On this last Sunday of the liturgical year, the Church celebrates the feast of Christ the King. Instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925, to combat the growing secularism and atheism of his time, it is one of the so-called "idea feasts" that do not celebrate an event in the life of Jesus but some aspect of His identity. In it we recognize and honour Christ as ruler of all. The original feast of Christ the King is the Ascension, in which the Church celebrates the exalted Christ, crowned with glory at the right hand of God. As the liturgical year comes to a close, today's celebration invites us to reflect on the shape of Christ's Kingdom.

The readings tell us that to Jesus Christ be glory and power for ever and ever. His are majesty and splendour, and His Kingdom is everlasting, a kingdom of cosmic dimensions. We honour the Lord Jesus today as a King whose Kingdom is eternal in time, universal in scope, and very personal in its power. This Kingship is radically different from the worldly understanding of kingship: the more reason Jesus slipped away whenever people tried to forcibly declare and make Him king. All things are created through Him and for Him but, showing the depth of His Father's love, Jesus pre-eminently demonstrated His kingship through His suffering and death, not by being served. He bore witness to the truth – the Father's love for us. As the face of the Father's love, Jesus emptied Himself (kenosis) and became a Servant-King, giving up everything in order that we may gain everything; He died so that we might live.

The nature of Lord's Kingdom is such that it endures in time, unlike human kingdoms that come and go. This kingdom is also universal: it is wide enough, strong enough to embrace, heal and bring forgiveness to every human being however they may come to it. Christ's kingdom is also very personal in that it is not about castles, knights of armour, and grand military battles. It is about the liberation of our soul from sin, setting us free to be the kind of person God intends us to be. Jesus offers us the truth about our life, ourselves and future. This truth will always set us free. This kingdom does not enslave us but sets us free. Its power is not from the world, but from the grace and life of the Risen Christ. We are part of this kingdom by virtue of our Baptism and made a stronger part of it through Confirmation. We grow in it through Penance and Holy Communion. We serve it through Marriage and Holy Orders and we draw its resources in illness through the Anointing of the Sick.

Christ Kingdom is a zone of strength, spiritual safety, and moral power from whose resources believers can draw during this life and in which we can live forever in the next. It is not somewhere in outer space: it is available in the Church and every human life can be part of it. Its length is indeed eternal; enduring beyond every human kingdom until the end of time and beyond. Its width is universal; big enough to embrace every human being who ever was and ever will be. Its reach is deep and personal into every human life. You are privileged to be a part and to share in this kingdom. If we have been far from Christ, next week, the first Sunday of Advent, is a chance to begin to unite ourselves deeply with Him. His Kingdom, Truth, Grace are as close as every church, sacrament, and Mass. These are the access points into Christ's Kingdom of saving truth and lasting life. The power and peace of Christ's Kingdom are here. However, the entry and embrace of this Kingdom is up to us. Be a part of this Kingdom!

Sincere thanks on behalf of the "Poor and Needy" whose hearts were gladdened with your thoughts, prayers, and offerings. Thank you for your offerings in cash and kind.

Congratulations to our dear Junior High School Leavers. God has answered your prayers and will surely crown your efforts with success. Your best and good conduct is enough. Victory is assured.

Dear students on vacation, take good care of yourselves, be helpful to your families, and be true ambassadors of your schools. We love you and hope you miss us! We hope to see you more involved in Parish and Church activities. Let us make the effort to deepen our faith and understanding of the Church and Her doctrines. In doing so, we will be forming our consciences against ideologies and false doctrine.

Please, remember to stay well, healthy and safe. Be not afraid to attend Mass. Get vaccinated when you have the opportunity. Wear your nose mask and observe all the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us!
