Look Up and Raise Your Head, Your Redemption is Near!

Dear People of God, today we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent (Year C) to mark the beginning of the New Year of the Church. As per the tradition of the Catholic Church, each New Liturgical Year begins on the First Sunday of Advent, not with looking back to our origins but with looking forward to our future. The Liturgy invites us to become a church of expectancy and hope, because we live in the light of a particular future. The Coming of the Lord at the end of time is a theme for our personal reflection.

We remind ourselves of the two-fold character of Advent: a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered; and likewise a time when by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. For these reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight; a time we recall the cry of the early Christians: *Maranatha*! "Come, Lord Jesus". This requires of Christians a serious preparation: not the kind done in the markets, banks, bakeries, fashion shops and hair salons. Our actual preparation should be mainly done on our knees. We commemorate an event which took place many years ago but whose effect remains ever-present; we prepare to welcome Christ born anew in our hearts and homes; we get ready for the Second Coming of the One who loves us unconditionally; and we deepen our relationship with the reason of the season: Jesus Christ.

Today's Gospel describes the Second Coming of Christ, the Son of Man, in cosmic terms. Rather than an image of servants facing a master's unexpected return home, or a householder guarding against a thief, St Luke portrays a cosmos wracked with upheaval. The sun, moon and stars, the powers of the heavens, and the roaring sea conspiring to terrify whole nations and making individuals die of fright. It not only speaks about the end of the world, but describes a new beginning, the final and complete establishment of the new, redeemed creation. When everything seems to have collapsed, people will see the Son of Man coming with great power and glory. Before the new world comes, the old has to be cleared away. The Lord assures us: "When these things begin to happen, stand up straight and raise your head, because your redemption is near at hand." This passage breathes assurance that believers will not only endure these and any other disasters, but in the midst of them all they will find their salvation revealed.

We are blessed to have this reading at the start of Advent because Advent is new beginning, a chance for a fresh start for the soul and spirit. The prophet Jeremiah in today's first reading looks to a new future for his people. Having experienced a history of failure in their kings, leading to situations of grim, Jeremiah says there will be a new bud, "just shot", on the old family tree of David and he will be the Messiah. Jeremiah gives us, as he did for the people of Israel of old, God's words of hope. God will raise up a "just shoot" to reign in the line of David, and of a time when the Lord God will rule over a Jerusalem fully restored and made whole. God's promises and His Covenant were not dead. There will be a new beginning with "Someone" greater than David.

Sometimes we are like Israel in Jeremiah's time: considering the great promises of God as dead and in the past. We are even tempted to be cynical when we see the behaviour of other Christians. Then comes Advent, we light the candles on the wreath and notice at this time of the year something odd. Deep, half-forgotten stirrings come to life inside us: the desire to reconcile; to get closer to Christ and His Church; to get in touch with friends and family; to set things right; to be at peace inside and out. The feeling of nostalgia may come to us with Advent, but for us Advent is about the future: stirring the drive, the search, and the need to fulfil something deep and holy that exists in us. Our world has changed a lot requiring of us to find new ways to express community, to show faith and to strengthen the bonds of family, friends and faith. Advent is a time of personal renewal, a time to prepare for Christmas and the Coming of Christ into our life with new power. Remember that what is at hand for the watchful and prayerful follower of Christ is not disaster but redemption. Rise up to it!

Next weekend, we all have the singular opportunity "To Give Thanks to the Lord for He is Good" in our 2021 Annual Harvest/ Thanksgiving. Think of what God has done for you, your family, friends, life and the work of your hands throughout the Year 2021, and show Him your appreciation. Please, do not be left out! God loves the cheerful giver.

Please stay well, healthy and safe. Be not afraid to attend Mass. Remember to wear your nose mask and observe all the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us.

God bless and keep you safe.
