Voice in the Wilderness: Prepare the Way of the Lord

Dear People of God, today we celebrate the Second Sunday of Advent (Year C). The Liturgical readings, especially the Gospel, invite us to repentance for the forgiveness of sins as a sure way to prepare ourselves towards the coming of Christ and to behold the salvation of God.

The first reading from the prophet Baruch reminds us of an essential theme of Advent. It speaks of the return of the Jewish exiles into their homeland. Advent is a time of return. This is made evident in our church community with the return of people to church. Our crowds get bigger, old faces reappear and new faces become evident. We sometimes get critical of the seasonal church attendees. Yet, whatever the reason people come back or come to church in this season and at this time of the year, it still remains a moment of grace for them. We only hope that we the regular church attendees will have the patience, generosity and hospitality to let them know that they are welcome. Who knows, maybe this time around, they will realize that they can experience a deeper life and a wider love for God and His church than they have known. They might even experience the redemptive forgiveness of Christ, and the grace and power of a new life in Christ.

Advent is a time to make people feel welcome, especially those who have been away. It is also a time for a return to God. It is a great season for the Sacrament of Penance, the fresh start that comes to us from Christ. It is a chance for us to return to a deeper relationship with Christ and His church. The Gospel reading describes this second feature of Advent: the wilderness, that place apart from the normal and daily activities of life. It is a period to carve out a space in each day to be with the Lord, to regain vision and keep perspective. In this time we make ready the way of the Lord through prayer, through reading of God's Word and spiritual reading in order to develop that space within us where God can speak to us. Just as we usually prepare the offices where we do business and the homes where we live, so Advent is a time to prepare the prayer life where we meet God.

St John, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, invites us to listen to his voice crying in the deserts of our lives: "Prepare the way of the Lord". In reality, the meandering paths and winding roads of our lives are straightened; valleys are filled; mountains and hills are brought low; and rough surfaces are made smooth when we repent and receive the forgiveness of the Lord. Repentance as we know means to change one's mind and to turn one's life towards God, who embraces us in mercy, forgives and welcomes us back home. Our repentance is our response to the invitation to "see the salvation of God". With our repentance we return back home to God and our homeland, the church. By this, we fulfill the prophet Baruch's prophecy of a glorious future promised Israel. The prophet Isaiah's prophecy of future glory quoted in the Gospel: "All flesh shall see the salvation of God" will be fulfilled when we return to God through repentance and forgiveness. Thus, repentance for forgiveness of sin is an essential requirement for us to see the salvation of God. The repented and the forgiven creates a quiet time of prayer where God can speak to him/her and where he/she can recognize His voice in the midst of all others.

Advent helps us to create that space within, that zone of honesty about ourselves, which will open up a way for the Lord to come to us. A personal relationship with Christ is not for a selected few. St Paul reminds us that his prayer is that we may learn to value the things that really matter. Advent calls us to recalibrate our compass, clean our moral glasses, and reboot our spiritual life by following and imitating Christ. It is a chance to return. What meandering paths or winding roads of our lives need to be straightened; valleys need to be filled; mountains and hills need to be brought low; or rough surfaces need to be smoothened? It's not easy, but possible and rewarding.

Today is a singular opportunity we all have as a believing community, individually and collectively, "To Give Thanks to the Lord for He is Good, His Steadfast Love Endures Forever" in our 2021 Annual Harvest and Thanksgiving. I believe you know what God has done for you; your family, friends, life and the work of your hands throughout the Year 2021, and you are ready to show Him your appreciation. Please, do not be left out! God loves the cheerful giver! God richly Bless and Replenish you for your Generous Thanksgiving.

Please stay well, healthy and safe. Be not afraid to attend Mass. Remember to wear your nose mask and observe all the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us.


