4th Sunday of Advent (Cycle C) 1st Reading: Mic. 5:1-4 2nd Reading: Heb. 10:5-10 Gospel: Lk. 1:39-45 **Rejoice, Be Reconciled To God!**

Dear People of God, we celebrate the Third Sunday of Advent (Year C), traditionally called "*Gaudete* Sunday", marking the midpoint of Advent. *Gaudete* is a Latin word meaning "rejoice" – an imperative taken from the readings of today. There is a mutual and lasting joy when sinful people return to God: they rejoice for being reconciled with God; and God rejoices over them.

The Liturgical readings for today are very cheerful. Although the prophet Zephaniah spoke to the people of Israel about the darkening clouds of judgment that were looming for them, a beam of light emerges as he tells them about the coming joy of deliverance: "shout for joy, O daughter of Zion. The Lord is in your midst, a mighty saviour.... He will renew you". Likewise, St Paul exhorts the Philippian faithful to "rejoice in the Lord always. I say it again, rejoice". St Paul wrote this letter about joy from prison. Both readings make reference to a joy deeper than "holiday cheer". "Cheer" they say is created from our surroundings: "joy" on the other hand emerges from within. It is thus expedient to pause to reflect on how to experience the joy of this Season. For most people, this is the season of the year that produces not joy but stress, anxiety, friction, exhaustion and even debt. There is a great deal of stress because the preparations for Christmas can overwhelm us. In addition, we are surrounded by images of the perfect Christmas, tree, food, decorations, family gathering, guests, and harmony. Ironically, Christmas is never that perfect; the prefect Christmas eludes most people every year.

St John the Baptist, in the Gospel, presents us with the way to profound joy that is at the spiritual heart of this season. Moved by his prophetic preaching about God's coming judgment, people from all walks of life come forward asking: "What are we to do?" They want to know how they should prepare for the Messiah. John recommends compassion to them: that ability to feel the pain and suffering of others. He tells them to share what they have with others, the opposition of selfishness and greed. To the tax collectors, he says do not extort money from people. To soldiers who came to him, he says do not abuse your power. For John, we clear the Messiah a path by repentance not so much by reading, singing or decorations. The Baptizer tells us in plain language to reform our lives in ordinary ways specific to our life situations. Moral conversion is thus a necessary preparation for the new era which begins with the coming of the Messiah. An era in which we see ourselves mirrored in those whose lives are fragile for lack of food, shelter, medical care, love, friends, and hope. Truly, those who are naked, hungry, thirsty, homeless, sick and lonely experience deep joy when someone, out of compassion, cares for them. Joy is rediscovered and celebrated when compassion is shown in real ways. Selfishness and greed, on the contrary, breed sadness. We are to be an instrument in God's hands so that people can discover and celebrate joy.

We can make John's message our own because the joy of this *Gaudete* Sunday, or the Sunday in the Advent to rejoice, comes from appreciating the fact that Christmas does not have to be picture-perfect to be truly Christmas. Christ can come to us, and indeed He comes to us, even in our imperfection. His Kingdom can begin to take root in our life today, this year. But, we need to prepare the way for the Lord, to clear Him a straight path to come. Whatever our limitations in life, we will be able to experience the joy of His presence. In Zephaniah's words, He will renew us on the inside with love: a promise of spiritual renewal, rejuvenation no matter our age and the condition of our health. For St Paul, the peace of God will guard our hearts and minds. This is a powerful security system; to possess the very peace of God within us no matter what is happening around us.

Repentance is thus the key to a joy-filled Christmas. With repentance clearing the way of the Lord, Jesus becomes and remains an important part of our life. With prayer of supplication and thanksgiving, our request is made known to God and surely God's peace will keep our hearts and minds in Christ. May our joy, excitement and anticipation be a sign to the world that Christ is always near!

Sincere thanks goes to everyone who generously adhered to our invitation "To Give Thanks to the Lord for He is Good, His Steadfast Love Endures Forever" in our 2021 Annual Harvest and Thanksgiving. May our thanksgiving and appreciation this year be a springboard for many more blessings and favours from God. Please, do not be left out, it is not over! God richly Bless and Replenish you for your Generous Thanksgiving.




