Dear people of God, we celebrate today the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C). In our readings, we read about the mission of God's faithful prophets, and how Jeremiah and Jesus encounter opposition and lack of faith among their own people. Because they both place their hope in the Lord, they are assured of God's protection from their enemies and are enabled to carry out their mandate. St. Paul also speaks eloquently of the greatest of all the gifts: the charism of love.

Chosen to be Prophets of Love

The first reading is a classic example of how the Jewish Scripture describes God's call of an individual to be a prophet. The divine initiative is highlighted and the nature of the prophet's ministry is anticipated, both its universal aspect as well as the resistance he will encounter. Christians, like Jeremiah, are chosen by God, who knew us before we were formed in the womb, and consecrated us even before our birth. We are chosen to be God's ambassadors in the world, to spread the message of truth in love, and to awaken the conscience of people to return to God. We can do this because God has assured us of His protection and guaranteed the success of our ministry. He has made us into a fortified city, an iron pillar, and bronze walls, against every possible enemy. None shall prevail against us, for God is with us to deliver us. Be strong!

The second reading speaks of love as the foundation of true spirituality. For our actions to be acceptable, they must proceed out of genuine love. Paul gives us a popular passage about love among Church members, struggling and stumbling through the painful process of trying to be together the Body of Christ. The Christians in Corinth were fighting with each other over almost everything: power, prestige, teachers, orthodoxy, supernatural experiences, places in church, charismatic gifts and talents. In comparing the Church to a body with many parts, Paul admonished Christians to come together as a Church, and pool their gifts together in order to be an inclusive community. For Paul, the most crucial need among Christ's faithful is for jealousies and contentions to cease and to be replaced by mutual acceptance and love: a more excellent way. The way to go is therefore love, which is the greatest gift that every Christian must desire.

Paul is not talking about romantic love or self-absorbed love, but sacrificial love that forgives, heals, speaks truth, seek the good of others, open to others, and does not envy. This kind of love makes the world go round. It is exemplified in the sacrificial love of parents for children; love of spouses for each other; love of patriots for country; love of Christians for the good of the Church; love of educators for their students; love of medical personnel for their patients. This is the kind of love that gives life because it is Christ's kind of love. If we do not find this kind of love around us, then it is our Christian duty to put it there. Indeed, the vocation of every Christian, notwithstanding other gifts we may have, is to show sacrificial love and build up people and the church around us. This requires teamwork in which all the players need each other. Truly, nobody has all the gifts the Church needs, but we all have a gift the Church needs to fulfill her mission. It requires mutual acceptance and sacrificial love.

In the Gospel, Jesus speaks the truth to the people. This enrages them and they try to kill Him, but He miraculously escapes. After reading from Isaiah, Jesus wins the approval of His people with regard to His programme of action (prophetic ministry). However, when He obliges them to enlarge their horizons beyond the boundaries of Israel, as the prophets Elijah and Elisha had forced their contemporaries to do, Jesus is rejected. His own people get so angry that they threaten to kill Him. Jesus's message to His people is prompted by love and concern for them, but their response shows lack of charity. His prophetic ministry (saving message) is meant for all, Jews and non-Jews alike. We must imitate Christ's inclusiveness as prophets of love.

Sincere thanks go to our outgoing Parish Executive and Council Members. We appreciate you for how far you have led our Chaplaincy. Well done and continue to support God's work. To our incoming Parish Executive and Council Members, we say congratulations. Thank you for the courage and desire to serve God, Mother Church, and our Chaplaincy in your respective capacities. May God richly bless your tenure of office as we strive to build up our community into the One Body of Christ and put our gifts at the disposal of others. Together we stand!

To my dear Students, we keep encouraging you to make the Chaplaincy environment an essential part of your life and stay on Campus and its environs. We pray life on campus returns to normalcy. Please, do take good care of yourselves! May God's Grace sustain us throughout the Semester.

Please be reminded to stay well, healthy and safe. Be not afraid to attend Mass. Remember to wear your nose mask and observe all the safety protocols. Get vaccinated if you have not. Your life is dear to us.
