Glory to The Father, and The Son, and The Holy Spirit

Dearest in Christ, today, Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, the core of the Christian Faith. Many people believe in God. The Christian alone believes that God is Three Persons yet One God. It is a difficult yet immensely comforting truth of our faith. The Spirit glorifies the Son of the eternal Father, and we in the Spirit give glory to God, for God's love has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. We are at peace with God our Father through our Lord Jesus Christ. This Spirit, who is Wisdom itself, will lead us all to all truth.

The Solemnity of the Holy Trinity was included in the Universal Calendar of the Church in 1334 by Pope John XXII. Before that, its origins could be traced to the middle of the fourth century, when the Preface of the Holy Trinity was composed, and to the beginning of the ninth century, when a Votive Mass of the Trinity was first composed. The Liturgy's celebration of the Trinity arose as a response to the fourth century heresy of Arianism, which denied the divinity of Christ, and gave rise to the formulation of the Creed we still recite at Mass every Sunday. The doctrine that God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit, Three Persons, and yet One God, has been the teaching of the Church since the very beginning. This mystery of faith makes the Christian a unique believer. This belief, based on Sacred Scripture, is a mystery to be lived, not a problem to be solved.

Jesus prays to the Father and promised to send the Holy Spirit. The ground for belief in the Trinity is that God is Love. Within the very being of God there is the play of a "lover", a "beloved" and the "love" that they share. This means that God does not exist in isolation but in communion of love and sharing. It is from this love that everything comes into existence, including humankind. Love creates unity of intention, thought and will. There is no confusion or misunderstanding because Their Oneness is made of Love. Fashioned in the image of the Trinity, we have become fractured and polarised by religion, politics, status, race, ethnicity, language, and so on. In the Trinity, we see our intended nature. As the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit relate to one another, demonstrating mutual love and working in harmony to accomplish the purpose of God in the world, we have a model to emulate so as to realise the unity the world needs. Love must define what we do, how we live, and how we relate to one another in the family, workplace, groups and societies, community, and the world.

The Book of Proverbs highlights the loving creativity of God. In it, divine wisdom is personified, describing herself as present with God before and during creation. This suggests that she surely knows the "secrets" of the universe. This divine wisdom, superior to human wisdom, is our guide and comfort through life, calling on us to be creative and loving in our daily lives: to bring order from chaos and to find delight in people. The letter to the Romans presents the reconciling work of Jesus

Christ. Paul reminds Christians that we have come to know "the grace in which we now stand" through "our Lord Jesus Christ". That love of God, he asserts, has come to us "through the Holy Spirit" which we have received as a gift. This community experienced some "afflictions" that have made for endurance, and endurance for tested virtue, and tested virtue for hope. In the midst of trials, they experienced the presence and saving action of a God to whom, as the Gospel Acclamation sings, they offer glory as "the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit". We are thus to live as people who are "at peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ" so we can comfort and support one another in affliction.

It is not enough for us to believe in God: we must know in what God we believe, the identity of the Christian God. God the Father, out of love, creates with wisdom. God the Son redeemed us and grants us access to the grace in which we stand. God the Holy Spirit sanctifies us, brings to completion the work of the Father and of the Son, guiding us to all the truth. We have God the Father and Creator, God the Son and Redeemer, God the Holy Spirit and Sanctifier as a presence in our life. This is not a scientific discovery, but the Christian experience of God as revealed through Jesus Christ. In our spiritual life we pray now to the Father, now to the Son, or now to the Holy Spirit as though we were switching channels. That is a natural thing to do since the mystery of God is so immense. At different times in our life we relate more deeply to the Father or the Son or to the Holy Spirit. The other Persons are not offended when we do so since God is One. It is a uniquely Christian privilege to know the Triune God, "equal in majesty, undivided in splendour", as part of our life. To believe the Trinity means to love creatively, live at peace through Christ's Cross, and witness to the truth. The doctrine of the Trinity is not a problem to be solved, but a mystery to be lived. It is not easy, but never boring.

My dear Students, we thank God for Journey Mercies upon you as you went home to join your family, friends, and to rest. Be helpful to your family, parish, and communities. We hope you are taking good care of yourselves. Always remember our Anthem. You are missed! God bring you to us safely and sound. See you soon! May the Holy Trinity protect and keep you safe.

Please be reminded to stay well, healthy and safe. Be not afraid to attend Mass. Remember to observe all the safety protocols. Get vaccinated if you have not. Your life is dear to us.
