Work Hard, Stay Humble And You Will Find Favour With God

Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C. The Liturgy of the Word dining protocols to educate us on good places at banquets. He reminds us that humility and self-knowledge go hand in hand. teaches the importance of being humble in the choice of plac-Those who conduct their affairs with humility shall be exalt- es when one is invited to a feast. People, who think of themed, while those who exalt themselves shall be humbled. The selves very highly and look for places of honour at the high humble shall rejoice and exalt before God in the assembly of table, may find themselves at the bottom of the table when the heavenly Jerusalem. God makes the new covenant of His love with the poor, the lowly, the down-trodden and the oppressed. It is therefore in a spirit of humility, the spirit of Jesus, that we make our celebration today, asking Him to accept the homage of the humble.

Meekness, they say begets humility. Christ, Himself sets this example. He is God, yet He does not cling to His equality with God; He humbles Himself, taking the form of a servant. Pride is a canker-worm that has eaten deep into our hearts as humans; it is an evil growth that denies us the favour God desires to bestow on us. We know the saying that pride goes before a fall, yet we remain in that state of pride. St Augustine is believed to have said: "pride changes angels to devils and humility changes men/women into angels". Humility is the mother of all virtues: it is the virtue of honesty about ourselves, our souls and our need of God's grace. Humility is not synonymous to weakness or a kind of constant selfdenigration by which we feel that we are supposed to deny our abilities and powers, those special gifts God has given us. It first of all clarity and honesty of ourselves, the gifts and talents we possess, and more importantly, about the gifts we do not have, our limitations.

The first reading, from the Book of Sirach, gives us the reflection of a wise man of the Old Testament to offset the of the world. As a sage, well-travelled and well versed in the many cultures and philosophies of his day which seemed quite attractive to his Jewish countrymen, he writes his own reflections on the Torah, on the wisdom of the nations, and on God's ways in the world in order to convince his readers of the superiority of relying on the Wisdom of Yahweh over every other source of guidance. In today's reading, he offers fatherly advice regarding humility and exhorts against a prideful life and attitude. He speaks also of how concern for the poor can atone for sin. For the author, the best way to be loved by God and by people is to be humble and always open to helping others. His exhortation is deep: the greater you are, the humbler you should be to find favour with God. It is only to the humble that God reveals Himself and in them, He is glorified.

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus often uses meals as an opportunity to teach something about God and people. In today's Gospel, Our Lady of the Holy Rosary, Pray for Us.

Dear People of God, today, we celebrate the Twenty-Second He shares a meal with a Pharisee on a Sabbath Day and uses God judges their true worth. Humility and the need to be constantly ready to serve the least, the poor, those rejected by all, should be paramount whenever people gather together to express their friendship, communion, and a desire to grow together at a meal. Meals bring people together and serve as a school of humility and service to humanity.

> In a society where places at table are given according to seniority and social rank, a place at table indicates one position in society: the higher in age or in social rank, the better the seat, and the greater the honour. Jesus invites His hearers to take the lowest seat instead and not to look for personal honour, but let the host allocate the right seat. Likened to the messianic banquet it is God who prepares the banquet, who invites and who gives each of us the place we deserve. Jesus, therefore, is inviting His fellow guests not to judge themselves but to allow God to look deep down into their hearts and see what they are really worth and give them the place they deserve. There is often a reversal when God judges us: the first will be last. God reveals Himself to humanity in the most humble state by taking human nature in the Incarnation of His Son. God opposes the proud but will supply His grace to the humble. To be God's favourite, we must embrace the virtue of humility. Let us work hard and stay humble to win God's favour.


