Material or Spiritual Wealth: Where Is My Heart?

Dear People of God, today, we celebrate the Eighteenth Sunday Jesus uses the occasion of a dispute to make His disciples underwithout Christ all is vanity and great injustice. We are encouraged to set our hearts on what will last forever. We only fool ourselves if we believe that our possessions will bring us happiness and life. We need to instead "grow rich in the sight of God".

The Book of Ecclesiastes, attributed to Solomon, presumably because of his reputation as Israel's greatest sage, thinks about the way the world is going and having thought, concludes that "All things are vanity". This runs contrary to other parts of the Jewish Scriptures that discerned a divine justice at work in the world. Rather than assert that good is always rewarded and evil punished and that the wise person can discern the rules of the universe and learn to live in accord with them in order to assure a measure of earthly success, the author of Ecclesiastes is convinced of the ultimate futility of human life and effort. Despite the author's pessimism, the book does contain a strong faith in the Lord and advocates for trust in God alone for security. Read in connection with today's Gospel, this text underlines the transitory nature of human wealth and accomplishment, and advises us to "grow rich in the sight of God".

The second reading, from the Letter to the Colossians, cautions and exhorts listeners to put aside all of the trappings of their "old ways" of life that precede their conversion. Using traditional lists of what should be avoided, the author's emphasis on Christ's risen life, in which the believer already shares by virtue of Baptism. The theme of detachment from worldly wealth found in the Gospel and the first reading is in line with the perspective of this text. The advice to "set your minds on things that are above rather than on things of earth" would quite rightly reject as excessive attachment to material possessions and pleasure such as Jesus condemns in the Gospel.

St Luke uses the travel section of his Gospel to teach a lot of things about being a disciple of Jesus. Last Sunday's Gospel taught us how to pray and today's Gospel teaches us how to look at our worldly possessions from the point of view of faith. Jesus refuses to be dragged into settling a dispute over inheritance and cautions the hearers, through a parable, that they ought to be attentive where they give their importance: to God or to their numerous worldly possessions. He invites us to trust Please be reminded to stay well, healthy and safe. Be not afraid God so completely that a new attitude towards wealth is possible. It may seem strange that Jesus is asked to act as a judge. Nowadays we divide our life into religious, social, political and economic sectors and try to keep them apart. Legal cases are taken to court, while pastoral and spiritual problems are taken to priests. This sort of division did not exist in Jesus' time. A religious teacher was expected to act also as a judge in case of dis-

in Ordinary Time, Year C. The readings invite us to have our stand that the kingdom of God is not just about solving some thought on heavenly things, not on the things of earth where daily problems. It goes much deeper and demands a radical change of the attitudes that cause such dispute: greed, envy and jealousy, which is giving too much importance to material possessions. With Jesus, a new era has begun when our usual concerns and worries of life are no longer important. Material wealth, money and possessions, considered as the security for the future are questioned by Jesus. Consider the extent to which we seek better material conditions of life or the commercial advertisements which exploit our desire for more things and push us to be consumers. However, Jesus teaches that looking for happiness by having more things is a false dream for two reasons: seeking for more and more does not make us satisfied and feel at peace. Likewise, the simple truth is that we are just passing through this world and in the end, will take nothing with us. God is our only lasting treasure and anything else that does not bring us nearer to God and to each other is not worth living for. What becomes of our being smart, enterprising, hardworking and blessed by God with a good profit and harvest?

> The rich man in his riches and happiness completely forgot what is most important in life: God and other people. He never thinks or speaks about them. He thinks only of himself, his heart is dominated by riches. One would expect that the man would show some gratitude to God who has enabled the land to produce the plentiful harvest. But God has no place in his projects. He hoped to provide for a good life tomorrow, but Jesus reminds him that only God is the master of tomorrow. One's life does not consist of possessions. God wants a new age where people do not think first of all of their own comforts, but feel responsible for each other's happiness, like brothers and sisters of the same family. Life is a gift from God, who can take it at any time. The rich man would have been wise if he had decided to share his riches with the less privileged, poor and hungry. His values are opposed to the kingdom's values. Christian existence is about accumulating spiritual wealth, not material wealth. It is vanity to desire a long life and to take no heed of a good life!


