## The End of Time Is Near

Dear People of God, today, we celebrate the Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C. The Liturgy of the Word reminds us that the Day is coming when all that is evil will be brought to nothing. Already Christ has given us the strength to overcome evil with His presence and in the Eucharist. He also teaches that His disciples will be persecuted as a necessary prelude to the Parousia (second coming). Through our perseverance, we will emerge victorious when the Lord comes again. As we await the Day, let us conscientiously fulfil our Christian obligations.

As we near the end of the Liturgical Year, the readings call to mind the end times in various ways. Malachi, an anonymous prophet, writing in the fifth century before Christ, encountered a great deal of moral laxity among the people during the tumultuous period after the return from exile. In this passage he speaks of a coming "day of the Lord", which will bring judgment upon humanity: punishing the guilty and rewarding the just. The idea of the "day of the Lord", already a very old one, is used to arouse the moral conscience of those who enjoyed privileges at the expense of the poor. Here, the symbol of the sun suggests that evildoers will be burnt and the righteous healed on the day when the Lord comes. The Psalm reaffirms the first reading's emphasis on God's justice which is coming. Human beings and inanimate created things - rocks, trees, hills and mountains - rejoice demonstrably at the coming of God to rule over them with justice. In our world where ecological concerns have become more and more pressing, one may easily imagine the "joy" of rocks, water bodies, fields, and trees at God's coming to reign over them with justice, which implies respect for the integrity of creation.

Having accompanied Jesus on His journey to Jerusalem, His life and public teachings are about to come to an end. Today's Gospel passage is from a longer "apocalyptic" passage that begins with admiration for the physical splendour of the Temple. This kind of "apocalyptic" speech seeks to reveal something about the future. Jesus' terrifying prediction of the destruction of the Temple is accompanied by more involved predictions of the end of times. The destruction of the Temple is for Jesus, a sign that the "end of time" has arrived, although this end of time cannot be fixed to a specific date. Events of cosmic or national significance are followed by descriptions of the persecutions that the Christian community will face, and the disasters that will befall individuals because of their faith. In spite of all these troubles, the disciples are to remain hopeful and vigilant and put their trust in God who will help them through His Spirit. Believers will be upheld and triumph over their persecutors not by their own power, but through the words and wisdom of Jesus. Though death is predicted for some, even death will not be the end of life for them. Believers are thus called to a counsel of patient endurance. Even with the horrors predicted, the picture of the Christians that emerges is not that of helpless individuals swept away on the tide of events. Rather, they have reason to trust and stand firm in their faith. In the face of over-

whelming circumstances, Jesus is present to us. God's justice, expected to be mirrored in human lives and communities and the whole created world, will bring final vindication to those of us who trust in God.

The imagery used in the readings today offers hard but consoling words to followers of Christ. They invite us not to confuse the challenges, difficulties and trials of the times with signals that the end is near. The challenges are real but Jesus' consolation to us in the midst of them is that not a hair of our heads will be lost; our endurance in the face of persecution will win us our life, and the Sun of Righteousness will shine with healing in its wings on all who are faithful to the Lord. Therefore, amidst the burdens we bear and the sorrows we share, we must muster up courage and keep strongly pressing on; patiently praying and being always on guard against false predictions. We should be careful about people who offer miraculous ways out of all our problems. The new world will be built little by little, with a lot of patience, tolerance, and some amount of suffering; and it must begin inside each one of us. The end of time also means the end to the world of sin, suffering, persecution, injustice, hatred, betrayals, disappointment, death, etc. This is the world that will be wiped out, demolished, and in its place will be taken by a completely new reality where only good will exist. By our perseverance as children of God, we shall secure everlasting life. Courage, raise your head high. Stay ready and fear not the end times.

Dear students, how are you doing? We miss you but such is life! We hope in the midst of the million things to do, we still nourish our desire to know Christ through a prayerful reading of the Bible and the Writings of the Church. Know that the endurance of darkness is the preparation for great light. When we persevere as children of God in the midst of challenges, difficulties and struggles, we will secure everlasting life. Let us continue to make our Catholic faith and presence felt in our home parishes. May God protect and keep us safe throughout the vacation. Pax!

Today, the Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, we celebrate the "6<sup>th</sup> World Day of the Poor". Holy Mother Church calls on you and I to show love, concern and care for the poor as our Christian duty. Please endeavour to show some love to the "poor" best way you can inasmuch as we pray for their needs. This is a sacred charge we must keep.

Please be reminded to stay well, healthy and safe. Be not afraid to attend Mass. Remember to observe all the safety protocols. Get vaccinated if you are not. Your life is dear to us.
