Advent: Living In Harmony With One Another!

Dear People of God, today we celebrate the Second Sunday of wild honey, and wearing a garment of camel's hair with a Advent, Year (A). The Liturgy this Sunday invites us to work leather belt around his waist. This is a sign that he is a person and hope for an era of justice and peace that embraces all of with a mission to accomplish, living a life of austerity and creation; human and non-human. This requires a constant and simplicity. His message, however, is stern and straight, pierccontinual conversion of heart and mind. To live in unity and in ing the ears and hearts, urging people to "repent for the Kingharmony with one another, to welcome one another as Christ dom of heaven is at hand". His message is particularly diwelcomed us, is a sign that the Spirit of the Lord is upon us and God's reign is inaugurated amongst us.

In the first reading, we hear about the prophecy of the prophet Isaiah. In this beautiful, lyrical description of a future, Messianic King, Isaiah gives us a vision of justice and peace that embraces all of Israel, the human community, and all of creation as well. Taken from a section popularly known as the "Book of Emmanuel", the passage begins with the promise of a king in the line of David, continues with a description of his reign, and concludes with the expected effects of his reign; a peace-filled new world order harking back to the Garden of Eden. The virtues of the king described by Isaiah are what the Christian tradition later on identified as "Gifts of the Holy Spirit". The reign of the king is marked by justice, with a right ordering of relationships in society, and the championship of the poor as its key ingredients. The signs of the messianic era, found in reconciliation within creation itself, enlarge the vision presented to include peace in all forms. Comforting is the warm and peaceful picture of harmony where the wolf is the guest of the lamb, and the calf and the young lion walking together with a little child to guide them. There will be no harm to be done. All will be peaceful. This picture of harmony shows that the reign of God and His peace is always a possibility. Conflict and tension do not have to have the last word. Every generation, including ours, has a chance for peace. To enjoy peace and harmony is a collective effort. It requires sacrificing our pride, being peacemakers, truth-speakers, respecting one another, and standing for each other's dignity.

St Paul, in today's second reading, exhorts the community in Rome to live in unity and harmony. His exhortation stems from the existing tension and feud between Jewish Christians and those of Gentile origin within the same community. For Paul, each group has a part in God's plan, hence, he exhorts all to accept one another just as Christ welcomed all of them. This sense of unity and acceptance is naturally expressed in heartfelt common worship and in giving glory to God. Advent, which is a time of waiting, emerges here in a context of patience and encouragement as necessary ingredients for unity and harmony within the community. It requires us to reach out to the difficult people in our life and try to see in them what Please be reminded to stay well, healthy and safe. Be not Christ sees in them.

St. John the Baptist is a prominent figure who appears always during the Advent Season with a strong and powerful message. In St. Matthew's Gospel, he symbolizes the end of the Have a Blessed and Fruitful Week and a spirit-filled Advent era of patriarchs and prophets and sets the stage for a new era beginning with Jesus. In today's Gospel, he is introduced as one preaching in the wilderness of Judea, living on locusts and

rected to the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to him for baptism. For John, there is much room for change, and there is an urgency in the situation because the One who is going to baptise with the Holy Spirit and fire is coming soon. He reminds us of the importance of reformation (repentance and conversion) as a necessary condition for heaven.

The Baptist's message is as relevant for us today as it was before the coming of the Messiah. Moral conversion, which is an ongoing process, is necessary to welcome the Messiah. He cautions, in the Messiah's era, no inherited privilege or mere external observances can substitute for true conversion or save an individual from the judgment of God. The fearful eschatological images of fire, wrath, the axe, and the winnowing fan (which separates wheat from the chaff) remind us of the painful wrenching required to free the world from the grip of sin, even though the idyllic vision of Isaiah offers us hope of ultimate outcome of such an effort. There is the need to repent and return to the ways of the Lord daily so that the Kingdom of God can take root, be natured, and grow in us. It is a call on us to look into the areas of our life, as individuals, families, groups, and communities that need to be reformed and changed to make our way of living and acting conform to the values of the Kingdom.

Beloved, today is special for us as a believing Community. We have a unique opportunity to thank God in our 2022 Annual Thanksgiving with the theme: "Let the Giving of Thanks be your Sacrifice to God and Give the Almighty all that you Promised" (Ps 50:14). How and what do you offer to Thank God for all His Blessings, Graces, Favours, and Mercies showered upon us all through the year? We hope you have prayed, counted your blessings, and are ready to Thank God. Come one, come all, and let us render onto God our Thanksgiving! God richly bless you for choosing to Thank Him.

Dear students, trust you are keeping safe and out of troubles! We miss you! Remember that justice and peace, fruits of the virtues and signs of the Messianic Era, call for daily moral conversion and lead to unity and harmony. May God protect and keep us safe throughout the vacation. Pax!
