The Good Shepherd: Selfless Love and Care!

"Peace be with you".

Dear People of God, today, the Fourth Sunday of Easter is also herd, He knows the temperament of each and each one's name. known as Good Shepherd Sunday because the Gospel readings in all three years of the Lectionary Cycle come from John 10. The Liturgy calls on us to celebrate and reflect on the life and action of the Good Shepherd and to imitate Him. Christ, the Good Shepherd, went before us through suffering and death, so that we could follow in safety and be with Him in His heavenly Kingdom. He is the "stone rejected by the builders which has become the cornerstone". He is the Good Shepherd who laid down His life for us. This day is also designated as "World Day of Prayer for Vocations", a call on Christians to pray for vocations to the Priesthood, Consecrated Life needs a saviour, so a lost sheep needs a shepherd. as well as Matrimonial Life.

Our first reading from the Acts of the Apostles describes Peter as being "filled with the Holy Spirit". It is in the power of that divine breath of God that he preaches; giving bold witness to the transformation worked in his life as a result of having received the Spirit of the Risen One. He tells the rulers of the people, the elders and the entire Jewish people that the cripple was cured "by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth", crucified but God the Father has raised Him from the dead. It is this same Jesus who is the stone rejected by the builders but who has become the cornerstone. He recalls the opposition between the work of people and the action of God. The chief priests are seen as builders, having found a stone that did not conform to their ideas and fearing it would destabilize the whole herd, invite him or her to the flock, to the Church. Here they will house, threw it away. For God, that stone was precious and He made it a cornerstone of the whole building. Hence, of all the names given to human beings in the world, Jesus' name "is the only name by which we can be saved". Beloved, names indicate character and and you will join the flock. The herds of sheep could be immense, numbering in thousands. A good shepherd was highly valued because he could make or break the owner of the flock. It is said that only after people moved to the cities did they begin to look back on the severe life of the shepherd as serene and Journey mercies upon you as you go home. Stay safe, and keep romantic. Rather than sitting in a meadow on a lazy afternoon surrounded by grazing sheep as popularly imagined by many, the shepherd had to be attentive to the weather and predators. He had to be sunshine. Jesus is indeed the Good Shepherd, who gave His life for us, knows each of us by name, and gathers the lost just as He brings new members into His flock. Where the flock is, there is the Shepherd.
