The Gift(s) and Fruits I Prayed For!

"Come Holy Spirit, Fill the Hearts of your faithful and Kindle in them ence of the Risen Lord, the command to go forth, and the giving of the the Fire of Your Love".

Dear People of God, today Mother Church celebrates the fulfilment of Jesus' promise of the Decent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles, to help them carry out the mission entrusted to them. Fifty days have elapsed since Easter and Pentecost celebrates the sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. It also marks the last Sunday of Easter, bringing the Easter Season to a close. The Liturgy honours the chronology of St Luke, the Evangelist, by placing our celebration of the Holy Spirit's descent fifty days after the Resurrection. The Christian Pentecost in Luke coincides with the Jewish Feast of Weeks, fifty days after Passover, a time of prayer for a good harvest, and later became a commemoration of the giving of the Law (Torah). In this light, Luke's presentation of the Pentecost Event calls our attention both to how the descent of the Holy Spirit resembles the Theophany (Manifestation of God) at Mount Sinai (fire, sound, and word) and to the effects of the Beloved, Jesus came and stood among His disciples at locked doors Pentecost as the "harvest" of the Paschal Mystery. The seed of faith planted by Christ, through His Paschal Mystery, in the hearts of His disciples gathered in the Cenacle, is today watered by the "fire" of the Holy Spirit, and immediately grows and bears a rich harvest, almost instantly.

The readings from Acts of the Apostles proclaimed in previous Sundays of the Easter Season are about events that took place after Pentecost. In other words, the effects of Pentecost have been the subject of our reflection and our celebration throughout the fifty days of Easter. The first reading tells us, in very few words, the story of the Holy Spirit's descent and how it was manifested: a loud sound (like the rush of a mighty wind), tongues (like fire) coming to rest on each disciple, and bold proclamation of the Good News thereafter by the disciples. The disciples who were shrouded in fear and prayed in secret were suddenly made bold and fearless, and armed with the power of the Holy Spirit, they went out to preach miraculously, by speaking in tongues strange to them, but familiar to their listeners. Glossolalia, a form of ecstatic speech-like babbling known in the ancient world and attested to in the New Testament, is presented here as intelligible speech, understood by listeners from around the world as communication in their languages. By naming the geographic origins of the Diaspora Jews living in Jerusalem at the time of Pentecost, Luke paints a vivid symbolic picture of the worldwide proclamation of God's mighty works.

The Psalmist also reminds us of the role of the Holy Spirit in Creation and the dependence of all earthly things on the Spirit of God for life and sustenance. The same Spirit who "renews the face of the earth" and sustains life is given as a Gift to the disciples to strengthen them to go forth in the name of the Lord. St Paul, in the second reading, develops the theme of the Spirit's diverse but unifying gifts. Making the point that the Holy Spirit mediates the believer's confession of faith in the Exalted Lord, Paul goes on to explain that the multiplicity of gifts in the Church is united by their Source (the Holy Spirit), and that indeed the body of people (the Church) is also diverse and yet one because of Baptism and the Spirit. God inspires in Christians a variety of gifts, services, and works; all for the sake of the common/collective good. Since all of us have been Baptized into the One and same Spirit, God bless and keep you safe. and made to drink of one Spirit, we are called to live by the Spirit.

Our Gospel reading, introduced by the description of the disciples gathered in fear behind locked doors, draws our attention to the reversal of their fear into joy and their transformation from frightened followers to Apostolic Witnesses. At the heart of this change is the pres-

Holy Spirit. In a gesture that recalls God's act of creation, Jesus bestows the Holy Spirit, from His wounded and risen body, by breathing on the disciples. This imparting of the Spirit is thus a new act of creation by the Crucified and Glorified Christ. Forgiveness and Reconciliation are equally central to the mission entrusted to them and enabled by the Spirit. This Holy Spirit, referred to as the "Spirit of God", "Breath of God", "Paraclete", and "Advocate", is the Third Person of the Holy Trinity. He is the Lord and Giver of Life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, as we profess in the Faith of the Nicene Creed. In the life of believers, the Spirit is the sustainer and giver of manifold gifts; architect of the Church; animator of Liturgy and the heart of Sacrament; and yet He is also the source which pushes believers out of complacency, empowers us to move beyond where we are at the present, surprising us with the amazing grace of God's challenge.

and said to them: "Peace be with you". The disciples were glad when they saw the Lord and their fears vanished. Have you locked yourself behind doors? Behind what/which locked doors are you hiding? What are your fears, worries, anxieties and preoccupations? Jesus says to you "Peace be with you". He is also breathing on you, your family, your situation, and all that concerns you, to receive the Holy Spirit. It is this Spirit that the disciples gathered together at one place - as we have done now - that suddenly came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind and filled all the house. He fills you and your home now. Appearing like tongues of fire, the Spirit distributed and rested on each of the disciples just as He rests upon you. The Christian is never alone. Knowing the importance of the Spirit in our lives we have been meditating on God's Word and Praying for Nine Days now in our Pentecost Novena that He may fall afresh on us, melt us, mould us, fill us, renew us and use us. Which of the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit have you prayed for or do you need in your life and faith journey to make a difference in your life and the lives of others? Is it Wisdom, Understanding, Judgment (Counsel), Courage (Fortitude), Knowledge, Piety (Reverence) or Fear (Wonder and Awe) of the Lord? May you receive the Gift(s) and Fruits you prayed for, Amen.

Monday following Pentecost Sunday or 20th May begins the Season of Ordinary Time. The traditional praying of Angelus resumes, in place of Regina Caeli, at 6 am, 12 noon and 6 pm daily.

We continue to encourage ourselves to find time, as individuals and families, to pray the Holy Rosary reflectively and with devotion. May Mary accompany us always in this month.


