Walk By Faith, Not By Sight, in Partnership with God

Dear People of God, today we celebrate the Eleventh Sunday in Ordi- we meet as a group/society to have Bible Studies and pray; when a nary Time, Year B. The Liturgical readings promise us God's hope and restoration. We reflect and meditate on how small things become great by the Power of God. The Reign of God, overlooked by most people as an insignificant seed, is cherished by those who know its full potential. God's Reign or Kingdom is presented to us as a mustard seed, though the smallest of all seeds, springs up and becomes the largest of plants, like the tender shoot from the Cedar which bears fruit and becomes a majestic Cedar. The Church of Christ is a tree God planted. From the smallest of seeds, it became the most noblest of trees and filled the earth. Christians are the birds of the air who make their home in Him. Thus, shall the just and faithful who are planted: they flourish, grow, bear fruit and are vigorous and sturdy, like a ce-

Two common phrases we are used to hearing today are "the bigger, the better!" and "the more, the merrier!" Many corporations want to be the largest in their industry. People want to live big, live in the biggest house, drive the biggest car and belong to the biggest/mega Church. Churches and prayer centres want to be the biggest of their time and organise the biggest events of a lifetime. Today's Gospel reading presents a contrast, in two brief but all-important parables: the parables of the Scattered Seed and that of the Mustard Seed. They both compare God's Reign to seeds. In the first, the seed grows slowly, day by day, when scattered upon the ground. The second, about the mustard seed, is very small, but when sown upon the ground, it grows large enough to give shelter and shade. Both parables are about big results emerging from small beginnings. A few bags of grain can produce a harvest to fill a silo. A tiny mustard seed can become a home for the birds of the air.

These agrarian images are beyond simple farming. They caution us to avoid identifying "size" with "significance". Experience shows that "bigger" is not necessarily "better"; nor "more" necessarily "merrier". We often find quality products in smaller businesses. Similarly, a majority does not necessarily decide what is right. Usually, minorities have been great "change agents" and carriers of truth for the rest of society. Renewal and revival have come through minorities. Confusing size with significance leads us to believe that the Church with the most members is effective. Size can often make a community or society complacent, fat and lethargic. Numbers at times create confusion by faith and not by sight, may our lives bear fruit in abundance! rather than a blessing. It is not the number of people who claim the name "Christian" that will change our world but the intensity with which they live their faith. The faith that makes a difference is not the one that grows outward but the one that grows within.

When we look at the beautiful world around us, we should call to mind the magnificent truth that the growth we see began with small seeds that grew slowly over the years. The same is true in our Church and spiritual life. God's loving care has established us in the Church Have a Blessed and Joyful Week. through Baptism and nourishes and watches over us through the Sacramental Economy of Salvation. Our spiritual vitality began with a God bless and keep you safe. trickle of water at Baptism. It grows with a wafer of bread in Holy Communion and a smear of Consecrated Oil at Confirmation. Slowly the graces planted in us through those Sacraments can grow into a heroic and life-changing holiness that profoundly affects others. The Church's life cannot be left out. The seeds of the Kingdom are always being sown. When parents teach children to make the Sign of the Cross; when religious education teachers, Sunday school teachers and Catechists struggle to hand on the truths of faith through their activities, teaching and catechesis; when marriage counsellors prepare couples for Holy Matrimony with the truths of God and the Church; when

Catholic visits the sick, help the homeless, and counsels the doubtful; when we celebrate Mass praying for the living and the dead: we are sowing seeds of the Kingdom. Which of them will grow and at what rate is not for us to determine. The growth will happen in God's appointed time. Ours is to sow the seeds: God gives the growth.

God's Reign unfolds in our moral conduct in our homes and workplaces when we are patient or forgiving towards those we live and work with. It is seen in the helping hand extended to anyone in need or the gentle and healing touch of the health caretaker. The reward we will receive from the Lord, as St Paul reminds us in the second reading, is not for the growth but for the number of seeds we tried and managed to sow. We all look forward to a great future for our nation and the Church. If and when that will happen, is not in our control. We should focus on faithful seeding, and generous planting, and leave the rest to God. Never count your small or humble beginnings as little and insignificant. Everything great we see around us started little, thanks to the Power of God. Embedded in little and humble beginnings is the potential for greatness. Our beginnings may be compared to a mustard seed, which is very small, but has all the potential. It is often overlooked by many, and seen as an insignificant seed, but those privileged to know its potential love and cherish it. Love and cherish your humble beginnings.

As a plant grows unnoticed by many, if not all, so does the development of God's Reign escape our awareness. There is, however, a difference in plant growth and the growth of God's Reign. A long time is usually required to see the progress of a plant. But time alone will not reveal the action of God in the world today: we need the eyes of faith. With the eyes of faith, we appreciate the Reign of God being realized in our midst, everywhere and at all times. Prophet Ezekiel assures that God will transfer His people from a place of oppression, poverty and misery to a place of justice, prosperity, and peace of mind. Only those with faith can realise this promise. No matter what happens in this life, we should strive to have faith, and look only to where our Lord has gone to prepare a place for us. The seed, primarily the Word of God, is sown in our hearts. Without it, even the promise made to the prophet Ezekiel will have no meaning. We must allow the seed to grow; only then can we reap the promises of God. As we walk
