The prophet Elijah was drawn to the mountain of God by into the One Body. It is in this light that St Augustine once said: the Lord who gave him food and drink. The Father draws us to Himself by offering us the Bread of Life at every Mass.

In our first reading, we read about the prophet Elijah's journey into the desert where he is nourished on baked cakes and water provided by an angel of God. We find Elijah at the point of despair, judging his mission as a failure, and asking for death as his only relief. However, the food provided by God's messenger nourished not only his body (enough to sustain him on a forty-day trek to Mount Horeb) but also his spirit. His hopes were renewed, and his encounter with God at Horeb provided the impetus for a new chapter in his prophetic ministry. Like Elijah, we are fed daily at the Eucharistic Celebration with spiritual food (Bread of Life, Living Bread), the centre of the Catholic Faith. In our Christian journeys, many are the times like Elijah, the challenges of life and our situations push us to the wall that we feel our only option is "it is enough; now, O Lord, take away my life; for I am not Jesus is indeed the Bread of Life, Living Bread. At Mass, He better than my fathers". We become incapacitated, desperate and give up; not wanting to do anything anymore. When all hopes are gone and we seem to have given up, the Lord comes to our aid with His nourishment to give us new strength for the journey. Our a journey to make, and in Holy Communion, the Lord gives us the God always draws us to Himself to feed and nourish us.

As we do today, believers gathered in the early centuries to celebrate the Eucharist, the Paschal Banquet of the Lord. In general, the order of worship for the Mass has remained quite consistent since St. Justin the Martyr wrote to the pagan emperor Antoninus Pius about the year 155, explaining what Christians did when they gathered. The Mass unfolds according to a basic structure handed down from those days. The structure is twofold. The first part is called the Liturgy of the Word and the second part is called the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

In the first part, the people of God gather and readings from Sacred Scripture are proclaimed. After the readings, a homily is offered, exhorting the Christ faithful to live according to the Word of God. There follows intercessory prayer or Prayer of the Faithful: for the Pope, the local Bishop, and for the needs of those within and without the community. In the second part the faithful present to the presiding bishop/priest their offerings in addition to Dear students, as you go through this period of examinations, gifts of Bread and Wine. After these are prepared on the Altar, the Eucharistic Prayer is offered to consecrate them with its various sharing Communion. The presider then offers concluding prayers you the very best of luck! Pax! and dismisses the assembly with the exhortation to live the Good News, which all have celebrated liturgically in Word and Eucharist. The Bread of Christ's human nature is the true nourishment sent from heaven capable of satisfying our need for a full life. The one who feeds on the Bread of Live shall never die, spiritually and physically.
