Loving Service, the Way of True Discipleship

Dear People of God, we celebrate today the Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B. In the readings, Jesus speaks of His rejection, torture, and shameful death, an occasion for us to reflect on our own challenges and difficulties for the sake of the Gospel. True disciples, we are told, are concerned not with status but with service to the poor, justice, and peace. We worship the Son of God, the wisdom that came down from above and became the servant of men.

Alexandria was a major city and intellectual centre of the ancient world, and home to a large, thriving Jewish community. The Book of Wisdom, composed in this context in the first century B.C., is important for its teaching on immortality, a concept that emerged late in Hebrew thought through dialogue with Hellenic culture. For the author of Wisdom, immortality creates an entirely distinct context for evaluating moral behaviour. The wicked, ungodly, because they believe everything ends at death, reject justice and uprightness in favour of a life of immediate gratification. The just, righteous, however, with faith in a life after death, have a greater incentive to do justice in the present life. Today's description of the just man, beset by persecutors who want to test his claims, prepares us for the prediction of Christ's suffering in the Gospel. The Psalm, one of lament, voices the anguish of a person beset by godless enemies but ends on a note of confidence in God's deliverance. The faithful, the upright, those who follow the Wisdom of God, may be persecuted, but their vindication is assured. Your vindication is near!

Ambition, drive, success and winning are the themes of the world today. And our teachings from St James and Christ seem contradictory. The second reading from St James is a composite drawn from two different exhortations: one on the question of true and false wisdom; the other concerning the origin of conflicts, that is "fights" and "war". Jealousy and selfish desires/ambition give rise to disorder and evil deeds, but purity, gentleness, openness to reason, mercy, harmony and peace arise from wisdom from above, which is God's gift. James critiques the chain of events that leads from jealous desire to criminal actions as one in which prayer is either lacking or distorted by a spirit of self-indulgence. In his view of wisdom and of conflicts, he sees cause and effect between inner dispositions and concrete behaviours. Justice brings forth peace, but an interior "war" of cravings, selfish desires, and covetousness gives birth to conflicts with others.

Jealousy, envy, and greed engender disputes, discords, and disharmony; our dissatisfaction with ourselves and the desire for what another owns destroys our inner peace, distorts our perspective on life, and makes it difficult for us to love others. What mostly feeds our jealousy and envy is the fear that we are unlovable. Yet God created us in love and for love and has given each of us particular gifts to use in the service to His people. Each one of us is unique and blessed just as he/she is. When we accept this truth, we can let go of comparing ourselves to others and our tendency to want to be great. We ought to reflect on that aspect of our lives where we need to be less competitive and argumentative and curtail the desire to win or have at all costs. Jealousy and anger shorten life, while anxiety brings premature old age. Beware of them! The harvest of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make

peace. We need to constantly remind ourselves that the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, without uncertainty and insincerity.

In the Gospel, as the Galilean Ministry draws to a close and the journey to Jerusalem begins, Jesus' prediction of His suffering and death deters the disciples from adopting a false Christology based on wonder-working and miracles. The disciples, however, fail to understand Jesus' prediction. They are even reluctant to talk about it, lest questioning Him reveals even worse news. Jesus introduces a teaching on apostolic service. He links discipleship with self-denial and turns the disciples' concern about social rank into an invitation to humble service as the way of true discipleship. If anyone wants to be first, they must make themselves last of all. In keeping with His example, the disciples are to recognize others as people to be served. This message does not fit with the way we see the world work. We are told that the disciple had been arguing over who was the greatest. Our society teaches us that being right, being first, or being the best, is all-important. Hence, people do things just to be right, first, or best, and that is wrong.

In Jesus' time, calculations of what honour was due to a person permeated social life. Thus, the topic of the disciples' discussion was therefore not a particularly vain or unusual one: the response of Jesus is rather unusual. His insistence on service as the way of discipleship, and indeed as the only true form of greatness, is crucial for Christians today. For Jesus, there is nothing good or important about being first or the best. He calls us to be like children and to consider ourselves the slaves of all. The greatness of a Christian consists in serving others. We are invited to be gentle and endure rather than revenge and retaliate; to bring peace to conflicts by being pure, peaceable, gentle, reasonable and merciful; and to be servant of all.

Dear students remember that jealousy and anger shorten life, while anxiety brings premature old age. Beware of them! Watch your ambitions, drives, and desire for success and winning: they could be sources of disorder, hatred, fights, conflicts, and war. As Christian Youth, we are called to be gentle and endure; to bring peace to conflicts by being pure, peaceable, gentle, reasonable and merciful; and to be servant of all. We continue to pray for Journey Mercies and God's protection upon you as you go home, do your attachments and National Service. Please take very good care of yourselves and be helpful to your family. Let your presence be felt in your home parishes and offer a helping hand. We love you so much and miss you already! Pax!

Please, remember to stay well, healthy and safe. Be not afraid to attend Mass. Observe the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us.
