Voice in the Wilderness: Prepare the Way of the Lord!

Dear People of God, we celebrate the Second Sunday of Advent (Year C). The Liturgical readings, especially the Gospel, invite us to repentance for the forgiveness of sins as a sure way to prepare ourselves towards the coming of Christ and to behold the salvation of God. We celebrate the marvels God has worked for us in sending us His mercy and forgiveness and calling us to share His glory. We await with joyful hope that “Day of the Lord” when His work in us will be complete. Like a furnished house, all Christians are to make changes in their hearts: rearranging the furniture of hate, unforgiveness, sinfulness, rifts, anarchy and discord in the living room of their hearts to make room for the coming Messiah.

The first reading from the prophet Baruch reminds us of an essential theme of Advent. It speaks of the return of the Jewish exiles to their homeland. It also announces that God is ready to display the splendour of the Messiah to all nations. Hence, the call to take off the garment of sorrow and affliction, and put on the beauty of God’s glory; that is the robe of righteousness and the diadem of glory. Because God remembers His people, His children will gather from all over the world rejoicing in glory as on a royal throne. The people walk back safely because God has ordered high mountains and hills to be made low, valleys to be filled up, and level the ground. It is a comeback time for Israel just as Advent is a time of return for everyone.

This is made evident in our church community with the return of people to church. Our crowds get bigger, old faces reappear and new faces become evident. We sometimes get critical of the seasonal church attendees. Yet, whatever the reason people come back or attend church this season and at this time of the year, it still remains a moment of grace for them. Our only hope is that we the regular church attendees will have the patience, generosity and hospitality to let them know they are welcome. Who knows, maybe this time, they will realise they can experience a deeper life and a wider love for God and His church than they have known. They might even experience the redemptive forgiveness of Christ, and the grace and power of a new life in Christ. God wants to lead all of us with joy, in the light of His glory with mercy and righteousness.

Advent is a time to make people feel welcome, especially those who have been away. It is also a time for a return to God. It is a great season for the Sacrament of Penance, the fresh start that comes to us from Christ. It is a chance for us to return to a deeper relationship with Christ and His church. The Gospel reading describes this second feature of Advent: the wilderness, that place apart from the normal and daily activities of life. It is a period to carve out a space in each day to be with the Lord, to regain vision and keep perspective. In this time, we make ready the way of the Lord through prayer, through the reading of God’s Word and spiritual reading to develop that space within us where God can speak to us. Just as we usually prepare the offices where we do business and the homes where we live, so Advent is a time to prepare the prayer life where we meet God.

St John, preaching a Baptism of Repentance for the forgiveness of sins, invites us to listen to his voice crying in the deserts of our lives: “Prepare the way of the Lord”. In reality, the meandering paths and winding roads of our lives are straightened; valleys are filled; mountains and hills are brought low; and rough surfaces are made smooth when we repent and receive the forgiveness of the Lord. Repentance, as we know, means to change one’s mind and to

turn one’s life towards God, who embraces us in mercy, forgives and welcomes us back home. Our repentance is our response to the invitation to “see the salvation of God”. In repentance, we return home to God and our homeland, the Church. It is the passage from sin and death to grace and new life in God. It requires acceptance of our sins, the need of God, and the desire to be forgiven. By this, we fulfil the prophet Baruch’s prophecy of a glorious future promised to Israel. The prophet Isaiah’s prophecy of future glory quoted in the Gospel: “All flesh shall see the salvation of God”, will be fulfilled when we return to God through repentance and forgiveness. Thus, repentance for forgiveness of sin is an essential requirement for us to see the salvation of God. The repented and the forgiven, create a quiet time of prayer where God can speak to him/her and where he/she can recognize His voice amid all others.

Advent helps us create that space within, that zone of honesty about ourselves, which will open up a way for the Lord to come to us. A personal relationship with Christ is not for a selected few. St Paul reminds us that his prayer is that we may learn to value the things that really matter: the change on the inside and to order our priorities aright, by remaining steadfast in good works. Advent brings to our consciousness how the valleys of our shortcomings and sins of omission shall be filled up; the mountains of our pride and arrogance shall be made low; the winding roads of our crooked ways shall be straightened; and the rough ways of our bad manners and ill behaviours shall be made smooth. We are called to recalibrate our compass, clean our moral glasses, and reboot our spiritual life by following and imitating Christ. It is a chance to return. What meandering paths or winding roads of our lives need to be straightened; valleys need to be filled; mountains and hills need to be brought low; or rough surfaces need to be smoothened? Be ready to welcome the Messiah any time He would appear. It’s not easy, but we can, and it is rewarding.

On behalf of the Chaplaincy Council and the Harvest Committee, we thank all parishioners for your support and generosity in the 2024 Annual Harvest and Thanksgiving. God richly Bless and Repentish you for your Generous Thanksgiving.

Dear students, God promises His merciful interventions in favour of humankind. Those who are ready, who have made the way for the Lord, who have passed from sin to grace and new life in God, who are pure and blameless for the day of Christ, will surely benefit. While on vacation, let us deepen our faith and understanding of the Church and Her Doctrines. We pray for God’s protection upon you at home, as you do your attachments and National Service. Please take good care of yourselves and be helpful to your family. Let your presence be felt in your home parishes and offer a helping hand. We love you so much and miss you! Pax!

Please, remember to stay well, healthy and safe. Be not afraid to attend Mass. Observe the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us.
