**Reverence for God’s Word in Our Christian Living**

Dear People of God, we celebrate today the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (C), declared as “Sunday of the Word of God” by Pope Francis in 2019. The “Bible” which is the “Word of God” is figuratively referred to as “Mirror”, “Rain/Water”, “Seed/Grain”, “Sword/Machete”, “Salt” and “Lamb/Lantern”. It is appropriate for us to reflect on the inexhaustible riches in God’s Word, appreciate it, and witness to it in the world around us. We are invited to listen and follow the Word to become that One Body with many members. Today we rejoice in the New Law that Christ has given us, which unites us with Him, binds us together as His people, and enables us to work together for His Kingdom. We listen to the Words of the Law and ponder on them in our hearts. Christians must celebrate, study, and disseminate the Word of God as a year-long activity.

Our first reading narrates how the people revere the Word of God, listen attentively, and allow the Word to touch their hearts. It is about a long reading and sermon that lasted half a day. The people of Israel had finally returned to Jerusalem from their exile but were divided, quarrelling, and hostile to each other. Not only did the city walls of Jerusalem and the temple need rebuilding but the people themselves had to be rebuilt into a community, into their religious identity. Ezra, the priest, brought forward a copy of the Law of Moses, the Torah, and solemnly proclaimed it to them. The people stood for the proclamation, heard an explanation to the reading, gave their assent (“Amen, Amen”) and then offered worship. When he ended, the people rejoiced not because it was over but because in his words and teaching, they had rediscovered their common roots and the truth of what they could be in the Lord, a truly chosen people. The proclamation kept the people in touch with their roots and with the future to which God was calling them. It served as a great force for unity for the people as a community and as one big family. Proclamation of the Word of the Lord gives spirit and life to listeners.

St Paul writes that though we are many parts and serve different functions and roles in our Churches and communities, through the readings and sermons, Jesus speaks to us to form and build up His One Body. The unity in diversity of the Body is such that the parts of the body which seem to be weaker are with greater honour, and our unrepresentable parts are treated with greater modesty, which our more presentable parts do not require: a body in which the members have the same care for one another. What part of Christ’s Body are we? We could be part of His mind, teaching the faith; His hands, reaching out to others; His feet, taking the Gospel to different places; His ear, listening to the anxieties of a weary culture; His lips, speaking His truth; His muscle, giving the Church strength and agility; the red blood cells, giving the Church vigour; or the white blood cells, fighting off error. St Paul invites us to know our state in life and our role in God’s plan as part of Christ’s One Body. In Christ, we have become one body with many members. Our unity in diversity is richness for our community and society.

Our Gospel is made up of two selections from different chapters put together. The first is from the introduction to the entire Gospel where St. Luke mentions the recipient of the Gospel, how he wrote it, and why he wrote it. The second part is taken from the first appearance of Jesus in His home village, Nazareth. Jesus reads a passage from the prophet Isaiah telling His audience what His mission is about and declares Himself as the fulfilment of the

prophecy He has just read to them. As the fulfilment of the Law and the Prophets, the Spirit of the Lord is upon Him and He is anointed to preach Good News to the poor. His mission is to bring liberty, justice, and freedom to people held in spiritual bondage in so many ways and the recovery of sight to the blind. Christ also has a mission of proclaiming the acceptable year of the Lord, the Great Jubilee. In Judaism, every Seventh and Fiftieth Year was a year to put things right that had gone wrong among the people. During the year, slaves were freed and lands restored to their original owners. All the divisions in the community had to be put right. It was a year of liberation for all: cancelling debts and restoring all children of God to their human dignity. We are in the “Jubilee Year of Hope” declared by Pope Francis to fulfil this aspect of Jesus’ Mission. This mission is ongoing!

The uncomfortable truths proclaimed by Jesus may not be pleasing to our ears but as His followers today, we have the same mission to carry out. There are many people whom the Good News has still to reach. Several people are waiting to be alleviated and freed from bondages of different types. Above all, we need the anointing of the Holy Spirit to fulfil the Mission of Jesus. We are the voices of liberation and are to witness the liberating work of Jesus in our time. The greatest reverence (attention) for the Word of God, as the readings illustrate, does not just mean to read or listen to it, but to live it out, to fulfil in our lives the message of the Scriptures. In this way, we become living witnesses to God’s message contained in the Bible and help build up the Body of Christ.

In his mutuo proprio of 30/09/2019, Aperuit Illis, Pope Francis declared that the “Third Sunday in Ordinary Time” be devoted to the Celebration, Study, and Dissemination of the Word of God. This “Sunday of the Word of God” should thus be a fitting part of that time of the year when we are encouraged to strengthen our bonds with the Jewish people and to pray for Christian unity. This day, devoted to the Bible, should not be seen as a yearly event but rather a year-long event, for we urgently need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures and of the Risen Lord, who continues to speak His Word and to break Bread in the community of believers. We remind ourselves of the tripartite exhortation “to Owe, Read, and Live the Bible” daily. We will be blessed to locate and make our Bibles very handy!

We say Welcome to our Freshers and Continuing Students, encouraging all to make the Chaplaincy environment an essential part of their lives and stay on Campus and its environs. May God’s Grace be with us throughout this Semester. Make the best out of every programme you are studying: it will surely lead you to your glorious destiny. We are encouraged to Owe, Read, and Live the Bible daily. May God’s Grace be with us throughout this Semester. Pax!

Please remember to stay well, healthy, and safe. Do not be afraid to attend Mass. Observe the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us.
