Response to God's Call: Here I am, Lord, Send Me!

Dear People of God, we celebrate the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C). Our readings for this weekend remind us of a truth about Christian vocation: God does not call the qualified; He qualifies those He calls. Prophet Isaiah, a man of unclean lips, beholds the Lord's glory in the Temple and is sent on a mission. Similarly, Simon, a sinner, responds to Jesus' mission by becoming a disciple. Paul, the persecutor of Christians, speaks of his call to preach nothing but Christ crucified and risen. Though we are utterly unworthy to be Christ's apostles, He sends us out to be fishers of men. He cleanses us from our sins and gives us the strength to say: "Here I am, Lord, send me".

The first reading, from the Book of Isaiah, describes the prophet's mystical encounter with Yahweh, in which he experienced a divine call to be the Lord's prophet. It is a typical and classic expression of the human person's encounter with what has been called the *mysterium tremendum et fascinans* (Rudolf Otto), the Absolute Mystery of God, which we find both terrifying and seductively attractive. The vision of Isaiah is a revelation of the awesome majesty of the infinite God. Yet, it also discloses a divinity in relationship with human creatures who wish those creatures to know something of the divine person. The Unknowable One offers a glimpse of His divine Being and directs the prophet to speak His words to people. This scene captures powerfully the conviction shared by both Judaism and Christianity that we are privileged recipients of the divine self-disclosure we term "revelation", and that this revelation is passed on to us through the medium of human messengers. In Isaiah's powerful vision of the holiness of God, he realised that not only the Temple but all the world is filled with God's glory. Isaiah was upset, because of his unworthiness and was frightened by the mission entrusted to him. But God is capable of purifying a person and making them fit to transmit His message, and Isaiah did not resist the call of the Lord. He replied: Here I am, send me.

St Paul, in the second reading, remembers the experience of God he had, different from Isaiah's, on a highway to Damascus. Paul, a devoted, if not fanatical Pharisee, persecuted the Christians and then somehow for reasons he could never fully understand, he was called on that road to Damascus to preach the Gospel by the very Christ whose people he was persecuting. On that dusty road, his life changed. He became, of all things, an apostle of Jesus Christ. He experienced forgiveness, redemption, and mission; and it was all free. There was nothing he had done to deserve it. It was a gift, a grace. We too can be cleansed and made whole not by our effort, but only by the grace of Christ's Cross and Resurrection. Paul's message of preaching was as simple as he had received: that Christ died for our sins, was buried, and raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and appeared to Cephas (Peter), then to the Twelve. This is the central message of Christianity and is what saves. It has cleansed, purified and saved many: it can do the same for you if you believe.

In the Gospel, different from Isaiah's Temple and Paul's highway experiences, we read about the calling of disciples at the seashore and the odour of fishing boats. Peter and his companions are there going about their usual work. Jesus tells Peter to go into the deep water and catch some fish. Well, Peter did not think much about that because they had been fishing all night and caught nothing. But he did what Jesus said and caught two boatloads of fish. Peter saw in that miracle the glory of Christ. He confessed his sinfulness and unworthiness. Yet, there and then, he was given a mission to be a

fisher of men. He knew that whatever our limitations, if we are faithful and obedient, Christ will use us to further His Kingdom. Though, Isaiah, Paul, and Peter, experienced different aspects of the majesty of God in different settings, what they learned of God from that moment marked their lives forever, and was something they brought to others. Their experience of God was a spiritual awakening (conversion) for them.

Jesus' word made such a deep impression on Peter that he allowed Jesus to challenge him in the very area where he thought himself competent: in his profession of fisherman. Peter thought he knew when and how to fish and needed nobody's advice. He hesitated when told to put out into the deep for a catch. But Jesus' word was so powerful and irresistible that Peter accepted the challenge and made the most important discovery in his life. When we accept to be challenged by Jesus' teachings, we discover that things can be different from what we thought. It moves us from our false and fixed ideas about ourselves, others and the world. When invited to follow Christ after these experiences, they left their work, family and friends to walk with Him. Many were taught, challenged and called by Jesus at the shores of Lake Gennesaret. They all listened eagerly but only some were invited to follow Him more closely.

In the call of the prophet Isaiah, and the apostles Paul, Peter, James and John, we are reminded that God does not call the qualified; He rather qualifies those He calls. He needs disciples with a listening ear, an attentive disposition, and a willing heart. God calls us to collaborate with Him in bringing people to His friendship. Our baptism imposes this obligation upon us: to become fishers of men, to go out and spread the Good News of Jesus Christ. This is the joy of the Gospel and our unworthiness should not discourage us. Good News is not something we keep to ourselves: we must share it with others. God is eager to use us to accomplish great things for His glory. Are you available, ready, and willing? We, like Peter, must own ourselves to be sinful, so that Jesus Christ might justly depart from us. But we must beseech Him not to depart, for woe unto us if the Saviour departs from us sinners. Let us entreat Him to come and dwell in our hearts by faith, that He may transform and cleanse us.

To my dear Students, we encourage you to make the Chaplaincy environment an essential part of your life and stay on Campus and its environs. God has called each of us to be His witnesses to the world around us. It is not by merit but by grace. It is not because we qualify, but He qualifies us for His purpose and mission. Ours is to avail ourselves and be ready, and God will use us. Know that, many are those who are eager to hear God's Word. Please, do take good care of yourselves! Make the best out of your programme of study: it will surely lead you to your glorious destiny. May God's Grace sustain us throughout the Semester. Pax!

Please remember to stay well, healthy, and safe. Do not be afraid to attend Mass. Observe the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us.
