True Happiness for Christ's Faithful!

Dear people of God, we celebrate the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C). Our readings invite us to look at where true happiness lies and warn that those who are trying to be daughters and sons of God often miss it. The standards of the world are not those of God. Jesus' way of looking at life turns upside down our usual ideals and values. Those called "blest" are those who trust in the Lord, those who are poor, hungry, weeping, and those who endure insult on account of God, for their reward shall be great: eternal life. Nothing in this world can rob us of our peace of mind and interior joy, because our trust is not in man, but in the crucified and risen Christ.

The Old and New Testaments present us with two ways of life: the way of those who trust and follow God; and those who follow the way of the evildoer. Whichever way we choose to follow, there are consequences. Those who follow the way of the Lord will be happy: they are like the tree planted beside the following waters and whose roots go into the stream. It yields its fruit in season and out of season and is not anxious in the year of drought. On the contrary, those who follow the way of sinners and the counsel of the wicked are on a path to sorrow and doom. Those who follow the Lord in this world, with the hope of eternal life, will have to endure many trials and tribulations. They will be poor, hungry, weep, insulted, hated, and persecuted. But they are the truly "blessed" ones; for they put their hope and trust in God, and their reward will indeed be great in heaven. All believers who take the precepts of the Gospel to themselves, and live by them, may take the promises of the Gospel to themselves, and live upon them. Those who are blessed indeed are those whom Christ blesses, but others must be dreadfully miserable who fall under His woe and curse. What a vast advantage will the saints have over sinners in the other world, and what a wide difference there will be in their rewards!

Prophet Jeremiah preached at a point of great moral decay and decline in the Jewish people's history, warning them of impending disaster if they did not repent of their sins and renew their fidelity to the covenant with Yahweh. Of particular concern to Jeremiah was how the kings of Israel were making alliances with various pagan nations. In his eyes, seeking security through reliance on the military might of their neighbours was tantamount to placing faith in the pagan gods of those nations. Today's first reading reflects a rhetorical style in which blessings and curses are juxtaposed to emphasize the only viable path to true happiness: reliance on God alone. For Jeremiah blessed or happy are they who trust in the Lord; accursed be the one who puts his trust in man. He is not asking his listeners to mistrust others, nor is he fostering in us a passive attitude. He aims to encourage us to reflect on the things that matter, and are really important. On what do base our lives: money, pleasure, theft, hatred, cheating, exploiting the work of others, selfishness, wicked friends; or do we take success in commerce, politics, trade, or our profession? We not are told God will punish us, but the prophet simply points out how this kind of life, based on human hopes, can only lead to disaster. What lasts forever is to base our lives on God: to believe in sharing, generosity, service, forgiveness and constant search for reconciliation.

We have dramatic and challenging words of Jesus in today's Gospel. The "Beatitudes" of Jesus, from St Luke, are different from those pronounced by Him in Matthew's Gospel. In the later, Jesus is on the mountainside where He gives us eight great visions of

discipleship, the eight beatitudes. The rest of that long Sermon on the Mount shows us how to attain them. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus is on a level plain, at a crossroad, and mingles with the people, apostles, disciples and non-disciples, rich and poor, those in sorrow and those at happier times in their lives. He pronounces, on one hand, "blessed" those who are poor, hungry, weeping, hated, excluded, and persecuted; and on the other hand, "woe" to the rich, the satisfied, the joyful, and those that people speak well of. However, when the Lord says "blessed" are you poor, hungry, and so on, He is not saying to those who are burdened by life that their life is ideal. The Lord is teaching us that there is a truth within their circumstances, a strength they do not realize. Within the tragedy of their lives is a hidden grace. Likewise, when the Lord says "woe" to the rich, the satisfied, and the popular, He means that there is hidden danger in their lives.

If as Christians we look for spiritual strength, eternal life, inner healing, full happiness, and deep fulfilment in the wealth we have or in popularity, we will be disappointed. Wealth does not insure happiness, a faithful marriage, or spiritual vitality. If we look for the truth of ourselves in the health and happiness of the moment, we can deceive ourselves. This world is but a fleeting moment. The Lord speaks of "woe" to the rich, the contented, and the popular because we can deceive ourselves and not go any deeper than these things. On the other hand, when we face poverty, need, grief, and unpopularity, illusions tend to evaporate quickly. For all of us who have known grief, we know that tragedy can be like a spiritual eye-opener: opening us to the deep waters of God's life, His will, and His grace. When things break apart, we discover the truth of human life: that our real anchor/hold is not material, but spiritual. Through these "blessings" and "woes", the Lord teaches us to look at what really nourishes our soul. The standards of the world are not God's. Christ's way of looking at life overturns our usual ideals and values. Do we draw our self-worth, identity, and purpose in life from the surface or stream? Blessed are they who trust in the Lord.

My dear Students, we encourage you all to make the Chaplaincy environment an essential part of your lives and stay on Campus and its environs. We have two opposite ways of looking at life: we must all choose. We say, through what we do, whether we put our trust in God, or we prefer to get the greatest possible enjoyment from the world. This second way seems safer and more logical. What Jesus offers contrasts with this human wisdom. Make the best out of your programme of study: it will surely lead you to your glorious destiny. May God's Grace be with us throughout this Semester. Pax!

Please remember to stay well, healthy, and safe. Do not be afraid to attend Mass. Observe the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us.
