**Present Yourself to God and Shine!**

Dear People of God, today is the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C which happens to be the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (2nd February). This feast, originating in the fourth century in Jerusalem, came to be celebrated in Rome by the middle of the fifth century under the Greek title “Feast of the Meeting” – as a remembrance of the meeting of Jesus and the old man Simeon. It has come to be known as the Feast of Light, Candlemas Day. This feast celebrates the close of the Christmas festival of light. Candles are blessed and lighted and we carry them in procession to welcome Christ, the Light to enlighten the Gentiles and the glory of His people. Jesus, the King of Glory, yet like us in all things, comes to His Temple to be a Light for all the nations.

Forty days ago, we celebrated the joyful feast of the Birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. Today, we recall the holy day on which He was presented in the Temple, fulfilling the Law of Moses and also going to meet His faithful people. Led by the Spirit, Simeon and Anna came to the temple, recognised Christ as their Lord, and proclaimed Him with joy. Our Lord Jesus was not born in sin and did not need the mortification of a corrupt nature, or a renewal unto holiness, which were signified at that time by circumcision. This ordinance was, in His case, a pledge of His future perfect Obedience to the whole Law, in the midst of sufferings and temptations, even unto death for us. At the end of forty days, Mary went up to the Temple to offer the appointed sacrifices for her purification. Joseph also presented the Holy Child Jesus, because, as a firstborn son, He was to be presented to the Lord, and redeemed according to the Law. Like Joseph, we ought to present our children to the Lord who gave them to us, beseeching Him to redeem them from sin and death and make them holy.

St Luke’s account of this event lays emphasis on the Incarnation. In becoming man, the Second Person of the Trinity subjected Himself to the Law. Just as Jesus in His ministry later paid the Temple tax, so Jesus had to undergo the rituals of naming and circumcision, and the ritual of presentation or dedication to God and the purification of His mother as required by the Law. In becoming man, the Son of God not only took on our biology but became part of the laws of human growth with all of the stages of development they entail and also obeyed the customs and laws of Judaism. In the second reading, the Letter to the Hebrews states that Jesus became like us in every way. Jesus did not exempt Himself from the ritual structures of Judaism. We should not consider ourselves as above the ritual life of the Church. The rituals of the Church are the ancient and living ways by which we express our faith and life in the Church. St Luke’s constant emphasis on Christ’s obeying the Law is a corrective to a view of faith as an internal, personal, and private feeling. Faith needs expression. Our Catholic faith needs Catholic expression. The faith of the Church needs expression through the Church.

The majestic song of Simeon in the Gospel also catches our attention. His canticle has become part of the daily “Night Prayer” of the Church. It looks beyond the “charm” of Christmas to the drama of Redemption. As the prophet Malachi spoke of the cleansing and purifying that the Anointed One would bring, Simeon spoke of darkness and light, the rise and fall of souls, a sign of contradiction and a sword of sorrow. Here, Simeon gives a capsule preview of the redemption work of Christ. Jesus did not come to speak humanly, affirming truths. He came to reveal sin for what it is, to show human beings what we can become, to transmit to us the grace and life of God, to bring forgiveness and call for the conversion of life. If

some people would accept His Gospel for the life-saving truth it is, others would not only ignore but oppose this gift and choose death over life. This “rise and fall” of which Simeon speaks continues today. Jesus continues to be a “sign of contradiction”. He remains a revelation of Light to people in darkness and is the glorious fulfilment of the Jewish tradition. When people reject the Lord, the “sword of sorrow” continues to enter the heart of His mother, Mary. Simeon also shows us the splendour of fidelity. He trusted that God’s Word to him would come true. We are called to the same fidelity as Simeon even though we might see only the beginnings of God’s purpose coming to life among us. The profound piety of the elderly prophetess Anna is an example of Christian living.

The blessed and lighted candles for today’s celebration indicate the ancient symbol of Christ. The proposed procession with blessed and lighted candles to honour Christ, the Light of the World also reminds Christ’s faithful to carry the Light of Christ’s Truth into our world where we dwell and work. Christians are to carry the Light of Christ into the world marked by a relativism that sees truth as plastic and commitment as only a temporal alliance. We carry Christ’s Light about fidelity, loyalty, and responsibility for our neighbours when much of our religious conversation centres on religious liberties and personal feelings more than the need for justice and service of the common and collective good. The Light of Christ is the enduring promise that night or darkness will never have the last word. Just as every generation has its darkness, so every generation is also given the Light of Christ. The world very much needs the Light we are called to be.

Today is observed as “World Day for Consecrated Life”. Its purpose is “to help the entire Church to esteem ever more greatly the witness of those persons who have chosen to follow Christ by means of the practice of the Evangelical Counsels” as well as “to be a suitable occasion for consecrated persons to renew their commitment and rekindle the fervour which should inspire their offering of themselves to the Lord”. Ayekoo to all the Consecrated men and women!

My dear Students, we encourage you all to make the Chaplaincy environment an essential part of your lives and stay on Campus and its environs. Be careful about the false teachings of the anti-Christ that are populating the media space about Freemasonry. The Church in union with the Holy Spirit has spoken: You cannot be a Catholic and a Freemason at the same time. The choice is yours! Do not be deceived or deceive yourself. Let Christ’s Light illumine our hearts and minds to His saving truth. We are encouraged to Owe, Read, and Live the Bible daily. Make the best out of your programme of study: it will surely lead you to your glorious destiny. May God’s Grace be with us throughout this Semester. Pax!

Please remember to stay well, healthy, and safe. Do not be afraid to attend Mass. Observe the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us.
