Keep Journeying, Love to the End!

Dearest People of God, today, the Sixth Sunday of Lent, Year C, we celebrate the Passion Sunday, also called Palm Sunday, to mark the start of Holy Week. The Church's Holy Week begins by recalling the joyful and triumphant entry of Christ into Jerusalem, and the immediate sorrow of the Passion narrative. Christ the Lord entered Jerusalem to accomplish His Paschal Mystery (Suffering, Crucifixion, Death and Resurrection) for the salvation of the human family. Jesus, humbling Himself out of love for us, did not shield His face from buffets and spitting but offered His life on the Cross. He relied on His Father's love and persevered to the end.

Acclaimed as King, One who brings Salvation (Hosanna means "Save!" or "Give Salvation!"), Jesus enters His City riding on a colt/ass/donkey to identify with the poor and weak. In recounting Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, St. Luke allows us to glimpse a deeper meaning in the traditional forms of welcoming pilgrims to great festivals, who were greeted by strewing palm branches in their paths: Jesus is the heir to David's throne, the fulfilment of prophetic hope. The palms in our hands symbolise Christ's royalty and reign of peace. He conquers by humility (riding a colt) that bears witness to the truth. The subjects of His Kingdom are the people who spread their cloaks on the road, rejoiced and praised God with loud voices for all the mighty works they had seen. People waved palms, welcoming Him like a king, but Jesus is a different King, a king of love and sacrifice. He knew His path meant pain, yet He walked it for us. The palms we hold remind us to follow Him, even when it is difficult to do so. Life brings struggles, but love can conquer all.

As we reflect on this day, let us embrace the challenges we face with the knowledge that Jesus walks beside us. In our trials, we are encouraged to remember His strength. His love will guide us in the same way He journeyed through Jerusalem towards the Cross. Palm Sunday reminds us to trust and follow Jesus, for He is our true King. The acclamation, "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord", is taken up by the Church in the "Sanctus" of the Eucharistic Liturgy of the Lord's Passover. Christ, the Suffering Servant, despite being divine, was humble to the point of death, so that we might have life in abundance.

A summary of human life can be experienced when one accompanies Jesus from Palm Sunday to Easter. Jesus is at the height of His popularity, receiving a rousing welcome for His fame as a wonder-working teacher. As we enter into the Holy Week, everything changes to betrayal, torture, suffering, pain, and death. The admiring crowds and the hosannas have become things of the past. Even being a participant in the Last Supper does not prevent one from betraying Jesus. The man dying on the Cross like a common criminal does not in any way appear like the Messiah who was acclaimed a few days ago. To survive His ordeal, in His most trying moments of crisis, Jesus turns first, not for human consolation, but to God. His story can be ours. What we contemplate today and this week is a graphic and realistic account of what every human life is. Fix your eyes on Jesus, the victory is yours!

The Holy Week, full of solemn celebrations, is ordered to the commemoration of Christ's Passion, beginning with His Messianic entrance into Jerusalem. The days of Holy Week, from Monday to Thursday inclusive, have precedence over all other celebrations of the Church. Principal within the Holy Week is the Sacred Paschal Triduum: beginning on Holy Thursday in which we commemorate the day Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist and Priesthood; Good (Holy) Friday in which we commemorate the day Jesus was executed on the Cross; and Holy Saturday in which we commemorate in the Vigil Mass Christ's emergence from the Tomb. The liturgies of these days are dramatic, "re-enactments" of events, by turns, touching, tragic, and triumphant, which happened during Jesus' last days and culminated in His victory over death. As

these days unfold, the liturgical assembly is thought to be engaged in acts of historical "reconstruction" that recreate scenes in the "Upper Room", on Calvary, and at the Tomb. Christians are encouraged to imagine themselves as actually present at these events – comforting Jesus during His fearful watch in Gethsemane, walking with Him along the Via Crucis (Stations of the Cross), and witnessing His miraculous "Return to Life" on Easter Morning.

Holy Thursday morning is the Mass of Chrism, concelebrated by the Bishop with his Clergy, as a sign of the unity and communion of the priests with their Bishop. For pastoral reasons, it can be celebrated on an earlier day. Besides the Renewing of Ordination Vows/Promises, Oils of Catechumen and of the Sick are blessed while the Oil of Chrism is consecrated in the liturgy for the sacramental life of the Church. The lay faithful present accompany their priests with prayers. The Liturgy on Holy Thursday evening, the Mass of the Lord's Supper, reminds us that Jesus celebrated the Last Supper with His disciples before the Feast of Passover. In it, He gave us His Precious Body and Blood and the means to have and receive Him in the Institution of the Holy Priesthood. In this same liturgy, we are invited to imitate Christ in His humility and service to humanity, typified in the Washing of the Feet of His disciples, and to adore the Blessed Sacrament.

Good Friday, Friday of the Passion of the Lord, the liturgy reminds us that, entrusting His life to the Father, Jesus bore our infirmities and obedient unto death, won for us eternal salvation. As we honour the Suffering and Death of the Lord Jesus, so too we prepare ourselves to share more deeply in His Resurrection. The Via Crucis, Proclamation of the Lord's Passion, Solemn Intercessions, and the Adoration/Veneration of the Holy Cross take centre stage of the liturgy. On Holy Saturday, the Easter Vigil in the Holy Night, Mother of all Vigils, the Church gathers around the Tomb with the liturgy of the Lucernarium (Service of the Light), Liturgies of the Word and the Renewal of Baptismal Promises to await the Risen Christ. The celebration calls to mind that the stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone and that if we have journeyed and died with Christ, we shall also rise with him and pass from death to life.

These faith-anchoring events are historical, and because they are historical, they cannot be repeated or re-enacted. Hence, the Church's long tradition insists that what happened once in history passes over into the mystery of the assembly's liturgical or sacramental celebrations. What the Paschal Triduum celebrates is Mystery, not history; Anamnesis, not Mimesis. In a sense, the liturgies of the Holy Week do not "take us back" to the Upper Room or the Path to Calvary. Their ultimate aim is not to retrace or relive the last hours of Jesus' life, nor to catch sight of Him emerging from the Tomb at Easter's dawning. They celebrate not what happened to Jesus but what is now happening among us as a people called to conversion, gathered in faith, and gifted with the Spirit of holiness. They celebrate God's taking possession of our hearts at their deepest core, recreating us as a new human community broken like bread for the world's life – a community rich in compassion, steadfast in hope, and fearless in the search for justice and peace. Let us participate actively, fully, and consciously in the celebrations of the Holy Week to enjoy the graces and fruits therein.

Please remember to stay well, healthy, and safe. Do not be afraid to attend Mass. Observe the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us.
