The Lord Is Truly Risen, Alleluia, Alleluia!

Alleluia, Christ is truly risen from the dead, Alleluia! The stone is rolled away! The tomb is empty!

Dear People of God, this is the day the Lord has made! Ps 118 rings out in the Church on this day of days that celebrates the Resurrection of the Lord. The Liturgy is imbued with Paschal, Baptismal Joy, for Christ has passed over from death to life, and the faithful, through Baptism, pass over with Him. On this day of days, we offer a joyful sacrifice of praise to the Father who raised His Son from the dead. We are invited to be intent upon the new life Christ offers us, Christ our Passover, who has been sacrificed. If we have died with Christ, we shall also rise with Him and pass from death to life. On Easter morn, the tomb stood bare – a tale of hope beyond compare. There began a story of faith. Mary came, her heart weighed down, to an empty tomb; no body was found. Swiftly, she ran to Peter and John, sharing the news, as the truth was drawn. John believed, and faith took flight. Peter also embraced the light. In the empty tomb is found a profound truth, hope and love forever unbound.

The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is all about transformation. It transformed Peter, a boastful coward, into a mighty orator who, on Pentecost Sunday, stood up to profess his faith in Jesus and His Resurrection. He would become a source of strength for sick people so that his shadow would fall on them and cure them. Many others who remained fearful behind closed doors came out in the open to testify to the Resurrection with great power and conviction. The Resurrection witnessed the transformation of people who fought for position, power, and greatness into simple people of one heart and soul. Since then, down through the centuries, thousands of ordinary men and women “turned the world upside down”. The Risen Christ is an active, living reality. Christians carry the joy and power of the Resurrected Lord with us wherever we go. Where there is despair, we bring hope; in troubled times, lasting peace; in disappointments, consolation; in illness, suffering and pain, comfort and healing; in hatred and loneliness, love; in injury and hurt, pardon and healing; in doubt and confusion, faith; in sadness and unhappiness, joy; in darkness, light; in discouragement, courage and strength; and where there are misunderstanding and fighting, we bring unity. The transforming power of the Resurrection must permeate all aspects and facets of human life.

Peter’s preaching in the first reading presents the entire scope of the Life, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus and its meaning for the world. Beginning with John the Baptist, Peter recounts the essential story of Jesus’ coming, preaching, the overthrow of the powers of evil, His passion, death and Resurrection, and the forgiveness of sins which result from these events. He speaks as one of the chosen witnesses who ate and drank with Jesus after His resurrection, thus emphasising the real, physical nature of the Resurrection. In its context in Acts, Peter’s speech is momentous. It provokes an outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon its hearers. Peter delivers this speech to Gentiles gathered in the home of Cornelius, who is a virtuous and devout non-Jew (Roman God-fearer). In the context of its Easter Sunday proclamation, the passage retains its urgency and eruptive power. It both announces the whole message of the Good News of Jesus, centring on His Resurrection, and states the universal import of that message in the Good News of the forgiveness of sins for Jews and Gentiles alike.

Peter’s witness invites us to reflect on the role of a faithful disciple, a chosen witness, and a messenger of the Easter message. The role

of the disciples is to be witnesses to three important things: the life of Jesus – all that He did in the countryside of Judea and Jerusalem; the death of Jesus – the fact that He hung on the tree (Cross) and died; and the Resurrection – the fact that they ate and drank with Him after His Resurrection. Those who qualify to witness the Good News are those who have kept faith with Jesus throughout the Lenten journey, who never abandoned the journey, and have learned to be of service in little matters. The Gospel confirms that the authentic witness of the Resurrection of the Lord is not necessarily about being the first to see it, or observing with care and being able to describe the event. It is in the ability to open one’s eyes with faith, that is, with spiritual insight. The Resurrection of Jesus goes beyond physical and scientific seeing or observing. Those who see without attention do not get the point of the Resurrection (Mary Magdalene). Those who seek to understand scientifically can arrive further, but are still not there yet (Peter). It is only those who see with the eyes of faith (the beloved disciple). Hence, the beloved disciple who reached the tomb first, also going in, saw and believed.

Set in the darkness of Mary Magdalene’s early morning pilgrimage to the tomb, the Gospel passage is an account of the several lights dawning: daybreak itself, the disciples’ discovery that the tomb is empty and their dawning awareness of what that fact meant, and finally, the beloved disciple’s coming to believe that Jesus has been raised from the dead. Most striking in this account is the role of the beloved disciple. Having heard Mary’s story, he outruns Peter to the tomb, yet allows Peter to enter first. Both enter the tomb, but the beloved disciple alone is described as believing. The beloved disciple, because of his love for Jesus, comes more quickly to discern and believe that Jesus is Risen. The power of love is that which puts the believer in touch with the truth of the Resurrection. Jesus wishes us all to be that beloved disciple, one who sees with the eyes of faith, with spiritual insight.

The joy of Easter is that we are all children of the Resurrection, and Alleluia is our song. The victory of Christ over sin, death, and evil, He shares with us. He has paid our debt in full, served our sentence in full, and won the victory in full for you and me. The Lord of Life has destroyed Satan’s culture of sin and death. The Risen Lord calls on us to stand against Satan and reject him and all his works and all his empty promises. We are all victors because we share in the victory of Christ. Jesus could not be defeated by death, man’s greatest enemy. He has won the battle fully and shares His victory with all who believe. In the empty tomb is found a profound truth, hope and love forever unbound. Let our spirits sing the Resurrection’s glory in this Easter as we rise from the shadows, our hope renewed, for Jesus lives, His promise is true. May the victory of life over death be made manifest in whatever we do and say. Blessed Easter to you all!

Please be reminded to stay well, healthy, and safe. Be not afraid to attend Mass. Remember to observe the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us.

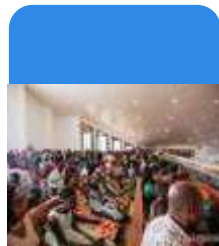
