Christ, our Passover, has entrusted to us the message of reconciliation: The parable of the Prodigal Son is an extremely dense tale, rich with inviting us to forgive one another and celebrate the unconditional and abundant love of God our Father. The people of Israel did not reach freedom by themselves, their own strength did not save them, but by God. Likewise, the younger son of the parable did not find his way home by himself, he was led back by the freely-given, unlimited love brother. Each of the three figures in the story carries an important of his father. The unconditional love of God the Father saved them.

Today, Laetare ("Rejoice") Sunday, in the old Latin Liturgy, so-called from the first word of the Introit (Entrance Antiphon), sets a tone of joyful anticipation of the Easter Mystery, as does the permitted use of Rose-Coloured Vestments, signifying that a pause in the rigours of penance may be appropriate at this stage of the Lenten journey. The reconciliation: indicating that an authentic conversion leads us to the readings of the first two Sundays of Lent highlighted some important Eucharistic Table. events in the life of Jesus: the Temptation in the desert and the Transfiguration. Last Sunday's readings looked at Penance and Reconciliation, revealing the God of mercy, compassion, and forgiveness who expecting Jesus, as a good person, to be close to them rather than to patiently calls us to conversion. Jesus thus addresses them and all of us who think ourselves better than others and want to dictate the rules to everybody else. Jesus shows that God is deeply concerned with those who are sinners. He does not discriminate in His love: He loves all, always, and unconditionally. God is compared to a Father who loses two sons. One actually leaves the house, led to a place where sin is made to look like fun and trapped in destructive, sinful patterns of living, but comes back later on. The other, who has never left the house - self-righteous - is lost as much as his brother. The Father welcomes both as his beloved children home with feasting and rejoicing. He is happy they have come back to Him. In God's love, not to have sinned is a good thing: but to be able to get up after a fall, help God, He will welcome and rehabilitate you, and restore you to your dignity, for His love saves. All have a place in God's heart.
