Christ Jesus, Our Good Shepherd

Dear People of God, today we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Easter, Year C. The Church celebrates “Good Shepherd Sunday” today, also known as “Vocation Sunday” and is marked as the “World Day of Prayer for Vocations”. The purpose of this day is to fulfil our Lord’s instruction to “Pray to the Lord of the harvest to send labourers into His harvest” (Mt 9:38). In today’s Liturgy, we offer in sacrifice the Lamb who takes away the sins of the world. He who was slain is now our Shepherd. He will lead to springs of living water all who do not reject Him. We are assured that Jesus is the Lord, the Lamb on the throne, who shepherds His flock and gives them eternal life. In His name, Paul and Barnabas proclaim the Good News to Jew and Gentile alike.

The first reading, an episode of Paul’s first missionary journey, recounts how the Good News was welcomed by some in the Jewish community at Antioch but greeted with jealousy and rejection by others. St Paul’s preaching brings about a revival. There is a clear hunger for the Word of God. Though the Gospel has the power to save and enthuse people, it also has the power to divide and enrage. We see the latter in the Jews’ negative reaction towards this great revival: while the Gentiles rejoice, the Jews fume. They fume because the people are “crowding the pews”, so the Synagogue leaders stir up opposition and dissent. Although the conflict between the Apostles and those who rejected their message culminates in the announcement that the Good News will be preached to the Gentiles, Paul’s explanation shows that the mission to the Gentiles is part of God’s foreordained plan, and not simply caused by Jewish rejection. As heralds of the Gospel message, we must be ready for whatever comes our way as we witness and proclaim God’s Word. Know that God has “set you to be a light for the Gentiles, that you may bring salvation to the uttermost parts of the earth”. Those in Antioch who persist in their newfound faith are full of joy and the Holy Spirit. These humble believers come to mind as we sing the refrain of the responsorial Psalm: “We are His people, the sheep of His flock”.

As mentioned above, the Fourth Sunday of Easter is also known as “Good Shepherd Sunday”. We are called to reflect and imitate the life of Christ, the Good Shepherd. The liturgy employs the images of sheep and shepherd to explore the relationship between Jesus and those who belong to Him. The Gospel highlights the gifts of eternal life given to the sheep and establishes the connection between Jesus the Good Shepherd and God the Father. Not only are safe pasture, guidance, and protection given to the sheep, but they are promised unending life. The providential care of Jesus is expressed by the image of the sheep being held safely in the hand of the shepherd: these are sheep that have been given to Him from the Father’s hands, from which no one can snatch them. Jesus can promise and give life to the sheep and protect them forever from destruction because of His oneness with God. Jesus affirms the personal and intimate relationship that He has with us as the Good Shepherd. Those who belong to Christ know His voice, He knows them, and they follow Him. This is contrary to our style of shepherd-

ing or leadership, where we find it difficult to identify with our followers. The only time we are close to them is when we are seeking their favour. Nevertheless, with Christ the Good Shepherd, we can align ourselves in order to achieve good leadership and lead our sheep/followers to greener pastures. In the spirit of emulating Christ, the Good Shepherd, we must be altruistic, sacrifice for our sheep, and respect their freedom. This metaphor of a shepherd connects with the Old Testament imagery we read in Psalm 23. There are times when it seems that Jesus is a million kilometres away, yet we must recognise that He is very near to us. He is the one person we can always count on.

The Book of Revelation makes reference to the “great trial”, a period of tribulation at the end of the world, yet the “tears” and “hunger and thirst” that will be wiped away by God are present realities for the hearers of this message. The white robes, palm branches, and flowing waters recall features of the Jewish festival of Tabernacles, as well as Christian Baptism. Christ, the Lamb who will shepherd this white-robed throng, is seated on a throne and identified with God. Christ, the Good Shepherd, not only shepherds us here on earth but also shepherds us into the Father’s Kingdom. He leads us safely to greener pastures and fresh water to revive our drooping spirit. As the True Shepherd, His way and what He teaches is to lay down His life out of love. His sheep are those who listen to Him and who courageously follow in His footsteps. Christ says: “My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me”. Are you a true disciple of the Shepherd?

We take the opportunity to wish All Mothers, Happy and Blessed Mother’s Day. You are sweet, and we love and cherish you. May you enjoy the fruits of your labour as you keep shepherding us as mothers! God richly bless you.

As Pilgrims of Hope, today is also designated as “World Day of Prayers for Vocations”. We thank God for our new Pope, Leo XIV, Successor of Peter, and Vicar of Christ. May God bless his reign. Let us remember to offer prayers for Vocations to the Holy Orders, Consecrated Life and Holy Matrimony.

Dear Students, we continue to pray for God’s protection upon you. While at home, hold on to your faith, stay connected to Good Shepherd by participating in your respective parish activities and personal prayer life. You have the Good and True Shepherd in your parish: He knows you and wishes you to hear His Voice and follow Him. Be one with God as you imitate His leadership style of service, sacrifice and respect for others. Do take good care of yourselves! May the Victory of the Risen Lord sustain us. Pax!

Please remember to stay well, healthy, and safe. Do not be afraid to attend Mass. Observe the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us.
