New Commandment, World, and Community!

Dear People of God, we celebrate the Fifth Sunday of Easter, Year C. Christ, at this season, puts fresh heart in us to spread His Kingdom. He gives us His New Commandment of Love and encourages us with the promise of the New Jerusalem. At the conclusion of their missionary journey, Paul and Barnabas tell the Antioch Community all that the Lord had accomplished in their preaching the Kingdom of God. To be marked by the quality of our love for each other, this Kingdom reaches its fulfilment in new heavens and a new earth.

The events surrounding the birth of new Christian communities described in Acts illustrate some essential elements of life in the Spirit of the Risen Christ. Founded on the preaching of the apostles, and continually encouraged by them, they are structured communities of faith and prayer, helped by the appointed elders. The life of these communities is marked by love and joy, and the attraction of new members. Today's first reading marks the end of the first missionary journey of Paul and Barnabas. Before returning to Antioch, the team returns to cities they had earlier visited to encourage and strengthen the disciples. They teach them that Christian life is a life of integrity, which would not be rosy but accompanied by struggles, oppositions and tough times. The Christian life is not a "cakewalk", but with prayer and fasting, believers can be assured that God will not abandon them. They encourage them to be part of the "fraternal centres" (parish or church) headed by "elders" appointed for them with fasting and prayers. This communal life becomes the essence of Christian living and faith.

The second reading presents the new world that will come about at the end of time when God will destroy evil. It also introduces us to a living Christ who stands at the centre of all things in heaven and earth, the Easter Christ, bearing the marks of His passion, yet reigning and receiving the worship of the whole universe. We see the destiny of those who persevere in faith: God dwells with them as His people, they are delivered from death, sorrow, mourning, crying, and pain; God wipes away every tear, lives among them, and shepherds them. God makes all things new, such that the former things pass away. Christians are invited into a vision of new heavens, a new earth, a holy city, and a new Jerusalem. Not only is the Easter Christian one who hopes for personal salvation, Easter faith reaches out to embrace the hope for a renewed cosmos, and a holy city, a new Jerusalem. This new world begins right now and is present wherever there is genuine love. This passage gives us a message of joy and hope, though our communities are full of people who are weak and lifeless, sick, full of problems, challenges, limitations and pains. Our destiny as people of God is "as a bride adorned for her husband", for God will be with His people forever.

Today's Gospel is from the "farewell discourse" Jesus makes to His disciples once the train of events leading to His crucifixion has begun. Christ presents His impending death as glorification. Far from being a defeat, His death is a victory. After, he presents the heart of Christian faith: Love. Though this love is there in the Old Testament (Dt 6:5), Jesus calls it a New Commandment because we are now to love as Jesus does. The command to love is made even specific: the disciple's love must be like the love that the Exalted Jesus bears for them. Thus, their love becomes a memorial and a sign of Jesus, just as the Eucharist is celebrated in imitation of and memory of Jesus. Love is the way all will know that they are His disciples. The life of the Easter communities founded by the apos-

ties must be permeated by love, and the new Jerusalem for which every Christian longs is where this love between God and humanity may be fully realised. Christ's love for us is sacrificial, unconditional, and practical. Mother Teresa of Calcutta once said, "For love to be real, it must cost, hurt, and also empty us of self". The measure of the disciples' love for each other is Jesus' love for them, and that is love without measure. They are to love each other to the point of giving up their lives for one another. The fraternal love of His disciples is the first witness of the new life that Jesus brought for all.

The difficulties and hardships we encounter in our world today are the result of a lack of love for one another. Aware of this, our Lord admonished His disciples to love one another. This command to love, though enshrined in the laws of the Old Testament, surpasses all because of its newness. In other words, no one has commanded people to love one another as they have loved themselves. Our Lord loves us with supernatural, forgiving, unlimited, and self-sacrificing love. It is with this kind of love that He asks us to love one another. Christ is not teaching us to love people because they deserve our love, but because they need our love. Jesus loved the poor, sick, outcast, wicked, corrupt, and His executioners, because only by loving them could they rid themselves of their misery. People will know that we are Christ's disciples if we have love for others. Our trying to love as Christ did is the Easter fire we bring to our families, friends, colleagues, parishes, members of our groups and societies, and fellow humans. As Christians, we ought to be known by our love.

Christianity is not just for the "websites" but for our "work sites". For most people, the strongest proof that Christ is truly risen is not found in any book but in how those who claim to be His followers are living. As a community of believers, Christians must exhibit the message we have been sent to give the world. It is sometimes easier to love people far away, people whom we do not have to deal with daily. But the Lord is teaching us that charity begins at home. People will be able to distinguish us as Jesus' disciples through the love we have for each other. In trying to love one another the way Christ loves us, we give a powerful witness to our world as Christians. This love prompts us to the rebirth of living according to the Gospel truth; rebirth of respect for all human life; the seedbed for a rebirth of respect for sexuality, marriage, human dignity, and for honesty. We are the cells of Christ's love. Let us live and spread love!

Dear Students, we continue to pray for God's protection and journey mercies upon you as you prepare for the second semester. While at home, hold on to your faith, stay connected to God and the Church by participating in your respective parish activities and personal prayer life. Christ gives us a New Command: Love one another as I have loved you. Do take good care of yourselves! May the Victory of the Risen Lord sustain us and bring you safely back to campus. Pax!

Please remember to stay well, healthy, and safe. Do not be afraid to attend Mass. Observe the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us.

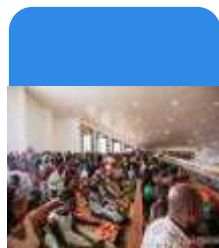
