churches, instead of giving up, we should call on the Holy Spirit for direction and discernment. The Spirit will teach us the full truth if we pray to Him and keep our ears and hearts open to Him. All are apostles of the Lamb.

Today's first reading gives an example of how the Holy Spirit intervened in the early Church, which faced the question as to whether the traditions of Israel should be imposed on new converts: the controversy created by God's gift to Gentiles of faith in the Lord Jesus. What was initially an entirely Jewish body of disciples only gradually was persuaded by signs and wonders, and painstaking discernment, to fully accept Gentiles into the Messianic community of the Church. The early Church settled these doctrinal issues through a collegial process, which involved the whole together. Everyone has a chance to say what he/she think the Scriptures teach. Finally, James sums up all that has been said, putting together the activity of God and the Word: that is, God Scriptures. The final decision reached by the Church's leadership in Jerusalem through synodal deliberation, in a divine-human collaboration involving the many people and the Holy Spirit, is communicated and received by the Gentile community of Antioch. The emergence of these internal conflicts and issues within the Church indicates why Our Lord promised the coming of the Holy Spirit in the Gospel passage, namely, to direct the apostles and the Church. The unanimous decision of the early Church in matters of early Church.

The Gospel continues Jesus' farewell discourse. Ideally situated in the Liturgical Year to anticipate the coming feasts of Ascension and Pentecost, the reading tells both of Jesus's immanent departure and His promise of the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete, the Counsellor. After Jesus' departure, the Holy Spirit has the task of leading, teaching and reminding the Christian all that Christ had said. Christ invites His disciples to keep loving Him by keeping His commandments. Central to the passage are the words of Jesus concerning the "Peace" that He gives to His disciples. Peace is His farewell, and His gift to them - a peace that the world cannot give. More than a simple word of greeting, this peace will be a token of Jesus' abiding presence even as He leaves them, just as the Holy Spirit, Paraclete or Counsellor, will provide for the disciples those things which Jesus did for them in His lifetime. Thus, we have a clear picture of a community of disciples who will be cared for and not abandoned to themselves, even when Jesus departs from them. They are promised a divine indwelling, the gift of peace, and the Paraclete to guide and Have a Blessed and Fruitful Week. direct them.

Christ's promise of love and peace speaks in every age to the troubled heart of the human person, as well as to the common life of the faithful, and indeed to the whole world in which we live. His
