Christian Unity: One In Love

Dear People of God, we celebrate the Seventh Sunday of Easter, Year C, or Sunday after the Ascension of the Lord. We are reminded that the Church is wedded to Christ in the love of the Spirit and looks forward to the final fulfilment of that love in the glory of heaven. Jesus, standing at the right hand of God, prays for you and me, and for everyone who will believe in Him. He prays for our unity, not uniformity; for oneness, not eliminating our differences, but to be one in love. Stephen, the first martyr of the infant Church, washes his robe in the blood of the Lamb, the Alpha and Omega. He proclaims Jesus Lord and King, Most High over all the earth. In Him may all become one.

Last Thursday, 40 days after the Resurrection of the Lord, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Risen Lord into Heaven, where He sits at the right hand of the Father interceding for us. We celebrate the Ascension to express our Christian hope that where He, our Head, has gone before us, we, His Body, will one day follow, to live forever in the Kingdom of our Father. The Lord ascended to His Father amid cries of gladness, entering into the heavenly sanctuary. We are called to be His witnesses, mindful of the great hope to which we are called. The days after the Ascension, through the Saturday before Pentecost, are a time of preparation for the coming of the Holy Spirit. The Christian community is encouraged to have the novena of prayer and renewal in preparation for the Feast of Pentecost. Though saying goodbye is painful, this is not an unhappy one. The Ascension of Christ is less about "endings and goodbyes" and more about beginnings. Christ's Ascension is the culmination of God's plan for Christ Jesus, His return to His Father with His "mission accomplished". It is a culmination but not a conclusion. As Jesus is with God in glory, so is He with us in spirit. We are to be His witnesses, mindful of the great hope to which we are called to.

The account of Stephen's martyrdom in the first reading serves to model the death of St Stephen, the first Christian martyr, upon that of Christ. Like Jesus, he is accused of blasphemy and betrayed by false witnesses, enrages his persecutors by speaking of seeing the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God in heaven, commends his spirit to the Lord, and forgives those who put him to death. This suggests that those who believe in Jesus will conform to the pattern of His death as they struggle against persecution. The narrative of his stoning also introduces Saul in a villainous role. Stephen's Spirit-filled vision of Jesus standing (not seated) at the right hand of God confirms the position of an advocate at a trial. Though he has no fair trial, executed as a mob without the sentencing of the Sanhedrin, before God, who alone judges justly, Stephen finds his True Advocate and bears witness to Him. Stephen bore witness to Christ, undistracted by the mob's persecution, but fixing his gaze on Jesus Christ in glory. He thus washed his robe, had the right to the tree of life, and entered the heavenly city through the gates.

The eschatological vision of the Son of Man at the right hand of God anticipates the Christ proclaimed in the second reading. Taken from the epilogue to the Book of Revelation, in which John sums up the message of this entire work, today's passage announces Jesus, whose reign is all-encompassing, and who will come in judgment. In one brief passage, almost all the major themes that we experience in the Easter Vigil come into play: clean robes, tree of life, paradise, word, light, life-giving water, and the wedding feast. Most dazzling of all are the epithets for Christ Himself, who is the Alpha and Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end, suggesting the fullness of the Word made Flesh, who identifies Himself with King David,

God's anointed, the bright morning star, whose Kingdom is promised to endure forever.

The passage from John's Gospel is the last section of the Priestly Prayer, which concludes Jesus' farewell discourse at the Last Supper. In this prayer, Jesus intercedes for the people of God. He prays that the Father may keep His disciples always united among themselves. He prays for unity among all those who will someday come to faith through the words of His disciples. The unity for which Jesus prays is to be like the unity of the Father with Jesus Himself. He prays for a unity not understood as uniformity. In praying for our oneness, He recognises and rejects the boundaries and differences that divide us. Oneness is certainly not about eliminating our differences; it is about love. Two features of this "one in love" are especially noteworthy. First, this unity finds its origin in God: the very fact that Jesus prays for it suggests that it is not available through human striving or natural associations alone. Second, it cannot be a purely spiritual unity, for it must be evident enough to confront the world with a powerful truth: "So that the world may know that you have sent me, and have loved them even as you have loved me". Our unity will be a witness that it was the Father who sent Jesus and that we are truly His disciples.

As we prepare for Pentecost, let our reflection on this prayer of Jesus for unity become our own: that we may be committed to persevere in, be strengthened, and work for unity in, with and through the Church. As Christians, we have the responsibility of allowing the Holy Spirit to heal the various wounds of division, which threaten our families, communities, and the world at large. There are countless Christian denominations in our world today. Thanks be to God that Christian leaders all over the world talk about "Ecumenism". Christians must acknowledge the fact that we still cannot do everything in common. However, we can do much in common like fighting together against corruption, violence, injustice, killing of innocent people, human, drug and organ trafficking. We can also collaborate in education and health care. In doing so, as followers of Jesus Christ, we can be His true witnesses wherever we find ourselves, just like Stephen, who bore witness to Christ, even to the point of death.

We say welcome to all our students to the Second Semester. We hope you had enough rest. We encourage all of you to make the Chaplaincy environment an essential part of your lives and stay on Campus and its environs. Make the best out of every programme you are studying: it will surely lead you to your glorious destiny. Remember, Christ has prayed that we may be brought to perfection as one. Our responsibility is thus to work for and strengthen our oneness and unity. The Church is so diverse yet remarkably one. Let our diversity enrich our lives. We are encouraged to Owe, Read, and Live the Bible daily. May God's Grace be with us throughout this Semester. Pax!

Please remember to stay well, healthy, and safe. Do not be afraid to attend Mass. Observe the safety protocols. Your life is dear to us.
